Fall 2024 Global Allies Program – Advocacy Action Congress must deliver on Gavi!

1. Got only 5 mins? <u>Use this RESULTS online action</u> to reach your Senators and request that they co-sponsor the Resolution on Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance - <u>S. Res</u> <u>684</u> (Senate Resolution), and <u>H. Res. 1286</u> (House Resolution).

2. Have some more time? Write to (or call) the foreign policy aide for your members of Congress.

- Check <u>the RESULTS Scorecard</u> for past support of Gavi, or Maternal and Child Health more generally. If they've signed a Dear Colleague Letter, see a copy of <u>the signed letters here</u>.

3. Follow up until you hear back! If you've written an email, call by dialing the **Capitol Switchboard at (202) 224-3121** and asking for the office.

4. Consider drafting a letter to the editor to thank your member of Congress for signing on, encouraging other members of Congress to sign on, and build community awareness for this critical issue.

Write and submit a letter to the Editor

<u>Sample letter</u>

In 2022, 4.9 million children under the age of 5 died due mostly to preventable health problems like diarrhea, pneumonia, and measles. But there is a proven strategy to fix this.

Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance is an international partnership that provides essential support for locally-led vaccine programs worldwide. Since its inception, Gavi has helped vaccinate over 1 billion children around the world, saving 17.3 million lives. Gavi now wants to reach another 500 million children with life-saving vaccines over the next five years, while also supporting vaccine manufacturing in Africa.

The U.S just took a big step in putting this plan into action. At the June 2024 Gavi pre-replenishment meeting in Paris, the U.S. pledged at least \$1.58 billion for Gavi over the next five years. This is an excellent start. But we can do more.

I urge our members of Congress to build on the U.S. promise by increasing funding for Gavi in this year's annual spending bills.

Hello! My name is Name. I am a Returned Peace Corps Volunteer and constituent living in city or zip code. I am calling to share my support for Gavi, The Vaccine Alliance and House Resolution 1286/ Senate Resolution 684.

Shockingly, last year almost 5 million children worldwide died before their fifth birthday. The leading cause of death is a lack of access to basic health services like vaccines. Last year, 14 million kids missed out on the most basic vaccines and this is the most cost-effective way to save lives.

Since 2000, Gavi, the Vaccine Alliance, has helped improve access and introduce new vaccines to fight killers like pneumonia, diarrhea, and now malaria. Gavi is preparing to support over 20 African countries to introduce the new malaria vaccine and help others vaccinate low- and no-dose children for these insidious diseases.
