

Here are some examples, mostly from the US.

Patriarchy: At the national level in the US, <u>Title IX</u> states that "No person in the United States shall, on the basis of sex, be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any education program or activity receiving Federal financial assistance." This law had the intended impact, not fully realized at yet of literally 'evening the playing field' for female athletes in the US.
