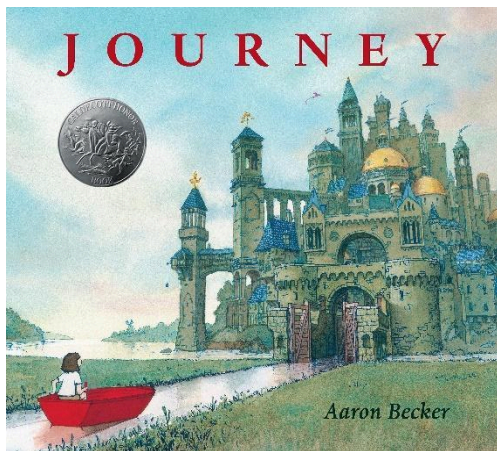


Thank you for taking part in the MML Mini Postcard Project.

Idea 1: Telling the story

Idea 2: Finding modes

Can you add words to the **SWIM** diagram to see how modes are used to build the story? The points below might help:

Sound: What makes a noise? Can you list objects and describe the sounds that they make.

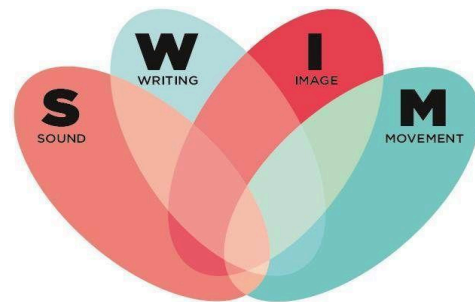
Writing: Using time connectives can you write an overview of the events in the story?

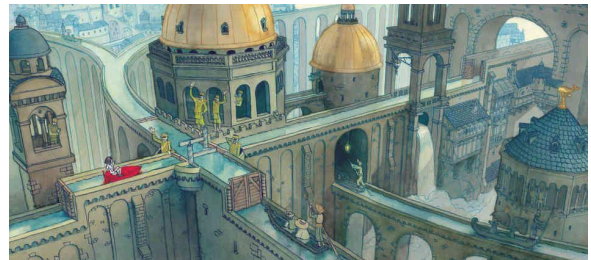
Image: Find the problem/ obstacle and how the red crayon is used to create a solution. Can you think of another idea and draw it? What colour crayon would you choose and why?

Movement: Describe how the flying carpet or purple bird moves.

Idea 4: Capture a picture

Take a picture of your favourite page and add a sentence **describing** what is happening.

Idea 5: Postcard
