2. **GEOGRAFIA** - Geography lesson of Spain and countries in Central America

DIVIDE GROUPS INTO 2 STATIONS (should be 14 at each):

<u>STATION 1:</u>

Yellow map WITHOUT names on countries

- 1. Say country names in Spanish (hold up words and point to country) and have kids repeat
- 2. Teach kids: "My Girl Even Has New Coffee Pots" for Central America
- 3. Hold up a country name and have kids find it on the map
- 4. After everyone has had a chance, split into teams and show one kid from each team a country name and have them find it place a small token or eraser on the country. If they have it right, they get a point! (not a race, just limit the time they have to choice by counting CINCO-CUATRO-TRES-DOS-UNO if they are stalling)

STATION 2:

Yellow map WITH country names

- 1. Divide kids into 2 teams, have them stand (or sit) in a line so you have 2 lines

- **3**. The 2 kids in the front of the line must place a **small token or eraser** on the country they think it is in
- 4. Reveal the correct answer. Remind kids you will REPEAT places, so PAY ATTENTION!

SNACKS: Teach kids about the snacks they are about to have:

- 1. *Galletas animales* (animal crackers) have them repeat the words and when they get their cookies, teach them the animal names if time
- 2. <u>Duvalin</u> usually eaten with a little plastic paddle, but would be yummy with animal crackers!
- 3. <u>Jarritos</u> fruit soda tell them it means "little pitchers" (as in a pitcher to pour a drink). Have them say what kind of drink they have mandarina (orange), piña (pineapple), tutti frutti (fruit punch) and limón (lime)
- 4. brave kids can try "pica fresas" spicy strawberry candy

TRIPA CHUCA:

- 1. Distribute game boards (two sets of numbers, 1-20, on a sheet of paper)
- 2. The first player draws a line from a 1 to a 1 without touching any other numbers or lines. The second player draws a line from 2 to 2 without touching any other numbers or lines and so on. It gets difficult as the kids start to fill up the paper with lines.

DURING THE ABOVE SNACK/TRIPA CHUCA... Take photos of everyone for their passports while they are playing (bring a **white board** for them to hold and write their name on it so we remember who is who!)

*Jensen will print them for next week and we'll stamp them with the 4 countries they visit!)

Station 1:Game/Song

Tamboré

The Tamboré is a folk game and dance that was done by men and women on Margarita Island.

- They start by making two rows, one with men and one with women (or they alternate men and women in each line). These rows or lines, stand face to face, usually with hands on the waist.
- They began the dance in step with a line as follows:On the line, "Que cante la niña, tamboré" (Let the girl sing, tamboré) both rows exchange positions, turning at the end to always be facing forward.
- Then they continue, "Que cante el niñito, tamboré" (Let the little boy sing, tamboré) and again they exchange positions.
- Then they sing, "Que cante la rana, tamboré" (Let the frog sing, tamboré). They exchange positions again, imitating the gestures and movements of frogs.
- Next they sing, "Que cante la mona, tamboré" (Let the monkey sing, tamboré). While imitating the movements of a monkey, they exchange positions and so on...

They continue mentioning names of animals and other things while imitating them for as long as they want to play the game.
