Debate Rules:

A member, after being recognized by the Chair, shall be granted the floor for a maximum of three (3) minutes for debate. This time limit does not apply to the reading of proposed amendments or the introduction of speakers. The Chair shall ensure that members request the floor before speaking, in accordance with Robert's Rules of Order.

A member shall not be granted the floor to speak a second time on the same motion until all other members who wish to speak have been given the opportunity to do so. In general, a member may speak no more than twice on any given motion.

The member who makes a motion shall have the first opportunity to speak to it, if they so desire.

Limitation of Debate:

Debate on each proposed amendment or main motion, including any amendments thereto, shall be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) minutes.

A motion to extend the time of debate by ten (10) minutes shall be immediately put to a vote by the Chair without debate. If the motion passes by a majority vote, the debate time shall be extended accordingly.

A motion to table or a motion to close debate shall not be in order before (2) speakers have had an opportunity to speak on each side of a debatable question.

Voting on the Main Motion:

Following the debate, a video recording will be distributed to all CCFF members. Members shall have seven (7) days to cast their vote on the main motion via an electronic ballot sent to their cerritos.edu email address.

Amendments to the Constitution require a two-thirds (2/3) vote of those members voting for passage. Amendments to the By-laws require a simple majority vote of those members voting for passage.
