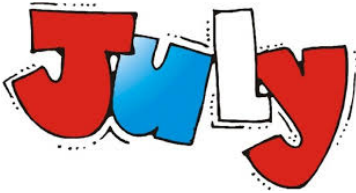

Use an hourglass, stopwatch, or timer to time a few short (1–3 minute) activities. Which took the longest? Which took the least time? Why? How many words can you read in 1 minute? In 3 minutes? How long does it take you to read one page of a book?	Count the windows and doors in your house. Are there more windows or doors? How many more? Write a description of your home. Be sure to include lots of specific details.	World Chocolate Day Count by 10s starting at 24 and stopping at 104. Leave a hershey's kiss or other small chocolate in the sun? What happens, why? Draw and write about your favorite type of chocolate candy.	Count the number of steps it takes to walk from your front door to the refrigerator. Now count backwards from that number. Read a poem about summer. Did you hear any rhyming words? How many lines were in the poem?	Count by 2s to 120. Using a clothespin, make a prediction about what types of items you can pick up with it. What do you notice? What would it be like to walk on the moon? Read a book about the moon or night sky in the dark using only a flashlight.	National Hot Dog Day Sam needs 15 hot dogs for a party, he has 7. How many more does he need? Draw or write about how to cook (or eat) a hot dog. Do you like hot dogs? Why or why not?	Make a square, rectangle, and triangle out of straws. Use the same straws to build a bridge. Draw and write about your bridge.	For each of these numbers: <u> 17 </u> <u> 25 </u> <u> 51 </u> <u> 48 </u> (or use dice or cards to generate numbers), practice writing the numbers before. Write an acrostic poem using your name.
