Launch of the #SafeToLearn Diagnostic Tool

On November 16th, Safe to Learn, together with UNICEF and UNESCO, hosted an event to present the Diagnostic Tool and showcase the experiences of 3 countries: Jordan, South Sudan and Uganda. The [Diagnostic Tool](#), which translates the [Programmatic Framework and Benchmarking tool](#), supports countries to measure and assess the degree to which existing programmes and policies are protecting children from violence in and around schools and meeting the five priority areas of the Call to Action.

The event provided a platform for three of the pilot countries to showcase their experiences and share some of the findings, recommendations and next steps.

- Learned about how the Diagnostic Tool supports countries in carrying out the Call to Action
- Gained understanding on how the diagnostic tool is implemented
- Learned how countries benefited from undertaking the Safe to Learn Diagnostic Tool and how the tool enabled countries to identify next steps to ensure all children are safe to learn

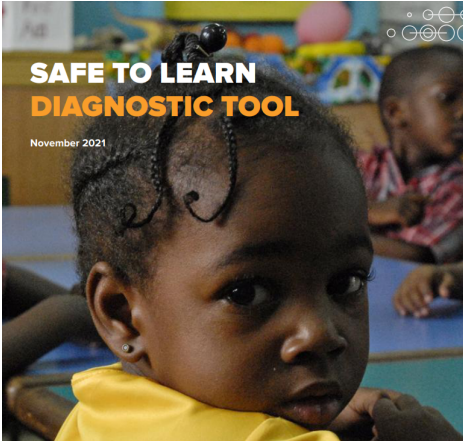

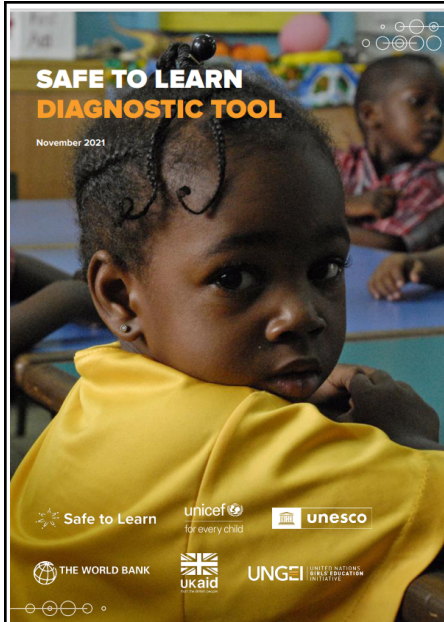

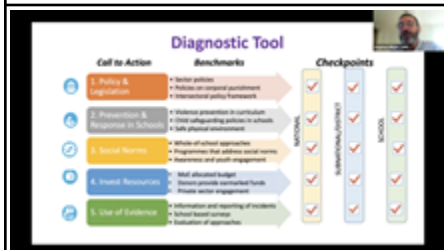


The Safe to Learn Strategy and Call to Action provide a roadmap for collective action so children can be #SafeToLearn.

 What difference did it make that South Sudan undertook the Safe to Learn diagnostic - The diagnostic research verified the existence and or the lack of policies and systems that protect learners against violence in South Sudan - The assessment enabled South Sudan as a nation to identify existing gaps and possible mobilize resources that would enable the implementation of the various recommendations. - It led to the establishment of baseline on ending violence in schools for South Sudan - The assessment highlighted gaps which it well addressed and possible positive change towards establishment of school safety in the Republic of South Sudan. - The report provided very clear recommendations and strategies to implement towards making the school safety.
