- Paige Niarchos working faithfully on her Graduation Challenge: painting a mural that hosts our district mission statement.



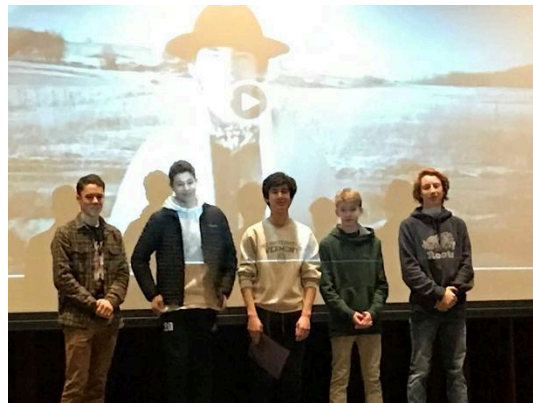
- From John Bennett: 2018 has already been a busy year for CVU's Scholars Bowl team. On January 12, CVU hosted 32 teams from 11 schools in a regional meet. CVU fielded six teams to go 25-5 overall at the event. On January 27, CVU participated in the first round of the State varsity playoffs as well as in the state JV championships, and came away with an advance to the final round and TWO JV State Championships. The varsity "A" team advanced to the quarterfinal round of the State playoffs, where they will meet Burlington on March 24. CVU B went 5-0 and won the JV A bracket, CVU C also went 5-0 and won the first ever JV B bracket State Championships. We have now won the JV State Championship 3 years in a row, and four out of the last five years. On February 17, CVU fielded a team at the VT History Bowl. Five team members participated, and the team went 4-2

against stiff competition to reach the finals of the event. In the individual History Bee, senior Henry Wilson reached the final round and CVU had four of the top 10 individual scorers. So far this season a record high number of 31 students have participated in Scholars Bowl events, and our teams have combined for a 104-25-1 record.
