

We found this online video maker by Vimeo to be one of the easiest to use. The interface is filled with prompts to guide you through the process so you don't waste time figuring out how to use the editor. Magisto uses AI to put together a video in minutes with minimal inputs required

from you. That said, you can also choose to take a hands-on approach and <u>edit your video</u> yourself.

Best for: Marketing or brand videos.

- 3+million HD stock videos and 25 million stock photos, and commercially licensed music.

It also includes a <u>screen recorder</u> and a Picture-in-Picture feature that enables you to overlay videos, images and slideshows in a single project, making it suitable for creating tutorials or recording gameplay.

Best for: Educators, vloggers, gamers.

- Online video editor interface is easy to understand and navigate even for first time video editors
- Supports different aspect ratios to suit various platforms such as IGTV, Facebook, YouTube and TikTok.
- Access to customisable templates, stock photos and footage, and audio clips.
- Can upload footage directly from your phone.



This online video maker is packed with templates of various themes, plus stock video, audio and photos. Renderforest is a handy tool if you're looking to create a promo video, logo reveal, explainer or music visualisation quickly. However, a big con is that you cannot create a video from scratch; you can only add your own images or footage to the existing templates.

Best for: Businesses, entrepreneurs.

- Varied templates, including animated ones, for a variety of uses including presentations, explainers, <u>slideshows</u>, YouTube intros and logo reveals.
- Interface is easy to use.
- 500k+ stock videos and 200+ music tracks.

- Video duration of upto 60 minutes with export in HD720 and HD1080 resolutions via paid plans.
- No watermarks on HD videos.
- Can add voiceovers.

- Free version allows you to create videos upto 60 seconds only.
- Only 360p, watermarked video exports supported by free plan.





Besides basic trimming and splitting functions, it's packed with features, including access to stock footage and audio, green screen and slow motion, simultaneous screen and webcam recording, and integration with Twitter and Facebook. But with no ready-to-use templates, this is a good option only if you plan on working with your own footage.

Best for: Educators, vloggers, gamers, businesses.

- Several additional features such as green screen, slow motion, screen and webcam recording, motion text, and an option to export audio separately.
- Can export videos in 720p and 4k HD resolution.
- Unlimited cloud storage and no cap on video duration. (Available on paid plans.)
