

Kings Remote Learning and Grading

K-6 Remote Learning and Grading

- Students are expected to engage with remote learning experiences and maintain learned skills. Students will demonstrate engagement by responding to activities and participating in classroom meetings. Teachers will continue to communicate with families and students on how to access assignments and participate in virtual experiences. If students need extra support, families or students should reach out to their classroom teacher.
- Students who are actively engaged during remote learning will receive a "CP" for completed learning activities and assignments.
- Teachers and school teams will make every effort to connect with students who are not engaged. Students with intermittent engagement will receive an "IC" for any incomplete assignments or activities. Our school teams will make every effort to support each student. If students are unable to engage in remote learning even with those supports from the school team, the school team will collaborate with students' families to determine future steps for the student's learning. A plan to mitigate lost skills and learning will be created.

7-12 Remote Learning and Grading

- Students are expected to engage with remote learning experiences; learn any appropriate new content and maintain learned skills. Students will demonstrate engagement by responding to activities and participating in classroom meetings. Teachers will continue to communicate with families and students on how to access assignments and participate in virtual experiences. If students need extra support, families or students should reach out to their classroom teacher.
- Students who are actively engaged during remote learning will receive a
 grade for the fourth quarter. The fourth quarter grade will be based on the
 2-3 weekly assignments given during the remote learning period. If students

complete assignments to the teacher's satisfaction, the 4th quarter grade can be no lower than the grade a student earned during the 3rd quarter. The grade can however improve if the level of learning supports it.

- Semester Final Grades for all high school credit-bearing will be calculated with each quarter weighed equally (50/50). Final exams have been eliminated for this second semester. High school courses will continue to use whole number percentages for grades.
- Teachers and school teams will make every effort to connect with students who are not engaged. Any student not actively engaged in remote learning will earn an Incomplete for fourth quarter and will be given an opportunity to make up work at a time when equal access to learning can be safely provided. Once the work is complete, the teacher will assign a 4th quarter grade.
