Connection to Student Outcome Goal	Artifact is connected to an identified annual student outcome goal that addresses either achievement or achievement-related data (hyperlink conceptual diagram and/or a one-pager of examples) - they may not have the final outcome data yet, but their artifact is strongly connected .			
Rationale	Artifact outlines a CSCP-coordinated, ASCA-aligned lesson, intervention, or strategy that clearly addresses a student need identified in school data .			
Standards	Artifact identifies 1-2 CSCP-related standards (e.g. ASCA Mindsets & Behaviors for Student Success, WA SEL standards).			
Process/ Participation Data	Artifact includes the following process data: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Who/how many students received the lesson or intervention (target group and selection criteria)? • How often did this intervention occur and for how long? • Outlines a bulleted list of topics covered during the lesson or intervention. Description of the lesson or intervention. 			
Evidence of Impact	Artifact shows data evidence of the lesson/intervention contributing to student impact in one of the following ways: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. There is a measurable shift in student outcome data (e.g. attendance rates, office referrals, grades, report card work skills/study habits, FAFSA rates, test scores, etc.) 2. Pre/post test data that shows how the lesson or intervention impacted students' attitude, knowledge, and/or skills 			
	Tables or graphs are used to illustrate data (bar graphs are recommended)			
Compass? GPS? Trip Report?	Artifact outlines tips, advice, strategies for other sites wanting to replicate this lesson or intervention, as well as challenges/limitations that were encountered and what you would do differently next time to navigate them			
Collaborators	Acknowledges the contributions of key partners who collaborated with the CSCP on this lesson, intervention, or strategy
