Guidelines for Intercultural Discussions

- 1. Be familiarized with the communication technologies to be used, VoiceThread, Zoom, etc.
- 2. Make use of multimodal resources (audio mode, video modes, pre-recorded videos, text, pictures, graphs, graphic organizers, links, etc.) to make your points clear and the communication lively.
- 3. Use official documents (e.g., curriculum guides, policy papers, etc.), scientific articles, reports, online resources, etc., to help your intercultural partners understand the information you are providing.
- 4. Have a clear understanding of the discussion questions. Do not hesitate to use your personal experiences to illustrate your points.
- 5. Ask open-ended questions, for example, why, how, what types of questions. Encourage your partners to share their thoughts and information by signing understanding, for example, nodding (if face-to-face) or posting emoji.
- 6. Use polite language, for example, would you, could you, please, thank you, do you mind, paying compliments, etc.
