#### **FAQ**

What courses will be held online?

Until further notice, all department activities will take place online. This includes classes, lessons and ensembles.

What equipment do I need?

- a decent computer
- solid internet connection (wired is best)
- device with webcam (and solid internet connection)
- keyboard (all students)
- your instrument (if you take lessons)
- a place to make noise when you need to

Can I have access to the practice rooms?

Until further notice, no one has access to the practice rooms.

I need a piano at home for my piano lessons since I can't get into the practice rooms. What should I look for in an electronic piano?

- 88 keys, weighted, touch sensitive, with pedal
- external speakers (built in, otherwise you'll need an amp)
- doesn't have to be fancy or expensive
- check used well-known brands can last a long time
- ideally pedal should be able to do shadings (not just an on/off switch)

Do I need a microphone?

Maybe, maybe not. You do NOT need a recording studio at home. Most smartphones have perfectly good microphones in them already that will do the job. If you do want to use a microphone make sure it picks up all the sound you need it to. Sometimes the sound picks up better without one. Basically no, a microphone is not required.

What video conferencing platforms will be used?

The University supports Teams and Lifesize video platforms. All other platforms are unsupported. Pay close attention to your instructor's information concerning the video platform they will be using.

A few thoughts about the new reality at MUSI this fall:

Like all postsecondary institutions, Brock's planning for the coming year is being formulated in response to best practices suggested by Public Health Ontario, and in collaboration with regional health related organizations.

As the plan suggests, all undergraduate programs including Music are being offered online. The recently released plan suggests that certain small group activities may occasionally be

granted permission to occur in person. We at Music are exploring protocols and safety procedures that might permit this in some cases, although whether or not we decide to proceed with some in-person activities will only be determined later in the summer. Our expectation is that, for the fall at least, even if there are a very limited number of on-campus activities in Music, these same activities will also be available in an online format. Our goal is to be safe and flexible for everyone.

Given the global nature of the pandemic phenomenon, faculty at Music have been working with collaborators nationally and internationally to develop the best possible online delivery for our students. Will it be different than an in-person experience? Absolutely. Will it be rigorous, playful, creative, and challenging? Absolutely.
