

Welcome to this tutorial on downloading titles in Sora.

When you borrow a title in Sora, it automatically downloads to the device you are using if that device supports downloading files. This is true whether you're using the app version of Sora or the browser experience. When the title has downloaded, you can then disconnect from the Internet and then read or listen on the go.

You can check to see whether or not a title has downloaded several ways, but most easily under the shelf tab where we are now. There you'll see a green check mark for every title that's been successfully downloaded. Tap that icon to switch from the downloaded version to the streaming version when you're connected to the Internet if you prefer. If that title is still in the process of downloading, you can check on the progress of that download by watching the green circle start to fill in like a pie chart. Or, if the title hasn't begun downloading, such as if you briefly lost internet connectivity in between classes or moving from the library to home, you'll see a cloud icon which you can tap once reconnected to the internet to begin that download process.

In the main menu of Sora, there are ways to check and edit your download settings for both the app and web browser version of Sora. Keep in mind that I'm using the web browser version today. For instance, this is where you can determine how your downloads are handled. Automatically for books of all sizes, which is the default. Automatically only for titles under a certain number of megabytes. Or manually, which means you'd have to tap that cloud icon next to your borrowed titles each time you wish to take them offline.

In the browser, you'll also see how much space you have for downloaded titles. And, you can even add a shortcut for Sora so you can find the website again quickly and easily. Rest assured that your eBooks and audiobooks are now ready for you in the classroom, at home, and beyond!
