Times New Roman, font 14, capitalized, left-justified, single line space for the section and subsection title, and double line space for the main text. Leave one-line space below the section title)

Manuscripts submitted to Journal of Environmental Management and Energy System (JEMES) should be separated into 3 files: Text, Figure, and Table. A manuscript text file containing title page, abstract, keywords, contents, acknowledgments, reference list and appendices...

Working details must be given concisely; well-known operations should not be described in detail...

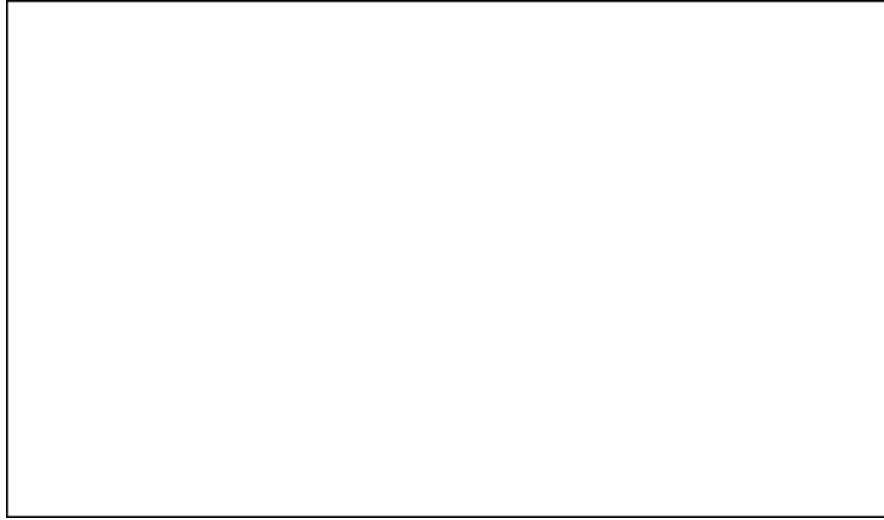
