TMS Parent Message - September 24, 2021

## Crusader Nation,

We have so much to be grateful for at Triad Middle School. Our students and staff members work extremely hard in and out of the classroom to make a positive difference in our community! The support that we receive at TMS from families, community members, and area businesses is certainly enviable. The outstanding reputation that our Triad schools have can be directly attributed to the outstanding people who live, work, and go to school in our communities. In this week's communication, I have included a variety of information and updates regarding programs and opportunities at Triad Middle School.

**Fall MAP Testing:** Please look for your child's individual Fall MAP (Measures of Academic Progress) report. If you did not already receive the report this week, you should expect for your child to bring it home on Monday. MAP tests determine your child's instructional level and measure academic growth throughout the school year. If you notice a "slip" in your child's scores, realize that it is common that most students suffer a "summer slide" as many fail to read, write, or work on math skills during the summer break. TMS teachers use classroom reports to target specific skills for instruction. If you have any questions or concerns, please reach out to your child's teachers. We are starting to roll out a variety of opportunities to provide support to students who are struggling with their learning or homework.

NHS Evening Tutoring Sessions: Have you ever been stuck in the evening not knowing how to help your child with their homework or study for an upcoming quiz/test? This is a common problem experienced by parents at night and one in which we have a solution. The TMS/THS faculty are partnering with National Honor Society students to provide Evening Tutoring Sessions in the Triad High School Library. The sessions will be held on Tuesday and Thursday nights from 6-7pm. While in the library, we will have faculty assisted by NHS students to help your child with their homework. This might be a great idea for students who are busy with extracurricular activities after school but still need academic support. There isn't a sign up process and students can come and go as they please. They just need to have their own transportation along with specific questions/materials to receive tutoring. This event will start Tuesday, 9/28 and run on a rotation, every Tuesday and Thursday (excluding Fall Break/Thanksgiving Break) until Thursday, 12/16 from 6-7pm in the THS library unless otherwise posted. Entrance to the library is to the right of the circle drive through the main THS entrance doors. There is a security aide who sits at a desk

who will allow students into the building. If parents want to wait in the library, they may do so. We hope that your children will take advantage of this opportunity!

Regional Champs & Sportsmanship: Athletically, our baseball and softball teams continue to impress! Both teams won their respective SIJHSAA Regional Championship games and punched their tickets to the state quarterfinals in Centralia. In the softball regional championship, Avery Grenzebach dominated on the mound pitching the Crusaders to a 21-0 win over O'Fallon Fulton Jr. High. Ben Sink was just as impressive on the mound for the baseball team, as he threw a 6 inning perfect game (with 16 strikeouts) to lead the boys to an 8-0 win over O'Fallon Carriel Jr. High School. We are just as proud of both teams for their character and sportsmanship as we are their dominating play on the field. I appreciate a parent from Carriel Jr. High sending me the following congratulatory email:

**Too Good For Drugs:** *Too Good for Drugs*, is an evidenced based prevention education program designed to mitigate the risk factors and enhance protective factors related to alcohol, tobacco, and other drug use. The lessons introduce and develop social and emotional skills for making healthy choices, building positive friendships, developing self-efficacy, communicating effectively, and resisting peer pressure and influence. Once a week, our 7th graders have a classroom lesson that includes lots of activities, games, and workbook exercises. Students will also bring home activities to work on as a family, and your involvement is highly encouraged. Please try to ask your student what they learned in this class each week and discuss it with them.
