- **Milken Scholars**
 - The Milken Scholars Program is looking to select students from the graduating class of 2021.
 - Milken Scholars must commit to maintaining a 3.0 grade point average throughout their undergraduate career and attend all annual program activities (expenses paid), including an annual Summit each summer. Scholars are also encouraged to participate in community service activities in their home and/or school community.
 - Milken Scholars receive financial assistance totaling up to \$10,000 and a range of resources that include:
 - An annual monetary recognition award of \$2,000 for each of their four years of college
 - A \$2,000 fund to assist them as they prepare to enter the workforce or pursue graduate school
 - Ongoing academic and career-related counseling
 - Assistance with career-related experiences through internships and shadowing opportunities
 - Eligibility Criteria:
 - Minimum grade point average of 3.6 (un-weighted) or 90 in all academic high school subject areas
 - Active participation in community service activities
 - A record of leadership
 - Financial or other obstacles
 - United States Citizenship, Permanent Residency, or granted deferred action status under the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals Program
 - Admission to a four-year college or university prior to final selection

- **PB&J Scholarship**
 - The PB&J Scholarship is for current senior students who have experienced personal challenges that may not have allowed them to perform well academically, but who still have the drive to succeed.

 - The Domestic Scholarship was set up in 2003 to benefit high school students in California. This is a merit and need based scholarship.
 - To be eligible, an applicant must:
 - Be a citizen or permanent resident of the US,
 - Demonstrate financial need,
 - Be a graduating California high school senior,
 - Have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.5,
 - Have successfully gained admission to an accredited 4-year college or university in the US and the applicant will be enrolled in a full-time undergraduate course of study no later than fall of the year of application.
 - Selection is based on overall academic performance, financial need, demonstrated leadership and participation in school and community activities, honors, and personal statement.

- **Cooke College Scholarship Program**
 - Awards up to \$40,000 per year for four years of undergraduate study to complete their bachelor's degree. The application is available exclusively via the Common App's online platform, which provides a familiar and streamlined experience for students.
 - Applicants must meet the following eligibility:
 - Plan to graduate from a U.S. high school in spring 2021.
 - Fall College Enrollment – Intend to enroll in an accredited four-year college beginning in fall 2021.
 - GPA – Earn a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.5 or above.
 - Income – Demonstrate unmet financial need. We will consider applicants with family income up to \$95,000. Last year's cohort of new college scholarship recipients had a median family income of approximately \$35,000.
 - This year, the Cooke Foundation will not require applicants to submit test scores for the College Scholarship Program application, and we will be “test blind” in the review process.
 - Deadline to submit application is October 30th, 2020

- **Most Valuable Student (MVS) Contest:**
 - The 2021 MVS application is now open. Applications can be found online at enf.elks.org/MVS. The application deadline is November 15th.
