If article is written in Indonesia, the abstract should be typed in Indonesian and English. Meanwhile, if article is written in English, the abstract should be typed in English only. The Abstract is a miniature contents of the entire writing statement, comprise: problem, purpose, method, scientific finding results, and short conclusion. The abstract should only be typed in one paragraph and one-column format

Method is implemented to solve problems, including analytical method. The method used to solve the research problems is described in this section.


Result and Discussion
