



General Court Guidelines

- The tennis club has priority use of the courts on Mondays and Wednesdays from 0900-1100 during April, May, September, and October.
- For player safety, all bags brought inside the court area must be hung on the fence and kept off the ground. If this is not possible, bags should be left outside the court area.
- **Net Setup and Takedown (Members):**
If you arrive and need a net, please retrieve one from the shed and set it up. When you finish playing, check with other players to see if the net will still be needed. If not, please take it down and return it to the shed.

When storing the net:

- Leave the posts inside the net
- Fold the net in half twice, then roll it up
- Place all posts and equipment into the storage bag
- Finally, place the rolled net into the bag

If you are the last person to leave, please ensure all club equipment (fencing, balls, etc.) is returned to the shed.

North Courts (Courts #1–4) All Levels – Open Play

Time: 7:00 AM – 12:00 PM Daily

- All skill levels welcome across all 4 courts.
- Guidelines apply whether or not courts are full.
- Players should always use the paddle saddle.

Open Rotation Guidelines

Fewer than 4 paddles in queue:

- 2 players on / 2 players off
- Winners stay on
- Maximum of 2 consecutive games

4 or more paddles in queue:

- 4 players on / 4 players off

Paddle Queue Guidelines:

- No rearranging paddles in the saddle.
- Partners wishing to stay together must wait their turn in the queue.



South Courts (Courts #5–8) Challenge Courts

Time: 9:00 AM – 12:00 PM Daily

- Challenge courts are organized by skill level.
- Guidelines apply whether or not courts are full.
- Players do not need a partner to participate.
- Players should always use the paddle saddle.
- Courts are intended for competitive, level-based play.

Skill Level Expectations

Players should participate at the appropriate skill level. Higher-level courts are more competitive, and players should play at the highest level of their ability.



Challenge Court Guidelines

- Winning partners may stay for a maximum of 2 consecutive games.
- Games are played to 11, win by 2.

1 paddle in queue:

- If winners stay on, the next player plays with one of the losing players.

2 or more paddles in queue:

- The next 2 players challenge the winning team.

After 2 consecutive wins:

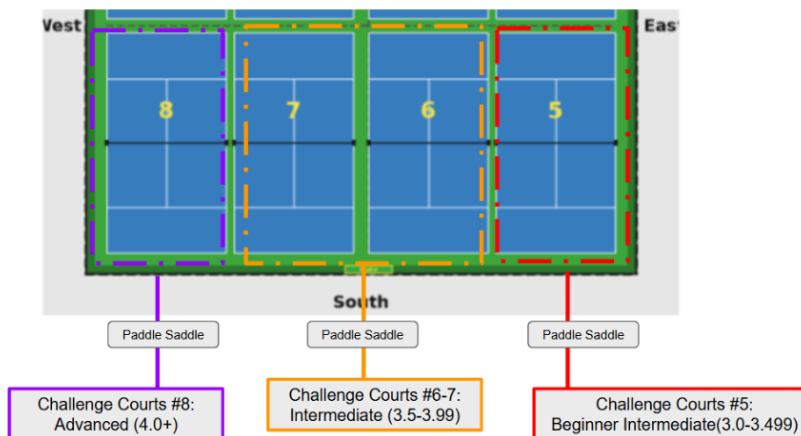
- Winning and losing teams rotate off.
- Losing players receive priority when re-entering the queue.

If winners rotate off and there are 3 paddles in queue:

- The next 3 players play with one losing player from the previous game.
- Losing players receive queue priority over winners.

If winners rotate off and there are 4 or more paddles in queue:

- The next 4 players take the court.



Court Skill Levels

- **Court #5:** Beginner Intermediate (3.0–3.499)
- **Courts #6–7:** Intermediate (3.5–3.999)
- **Court #8:** Advanced (4.0+)
