Mt. Hebron's Flu clinic for students will be held October 27, 2022. If you want your child to receive a flu vaccination, complete the online consent form no later than Friday, October 21st. NO EXCEPTIONS.

Registration closes 5 days prior to clinic.

Registration will be online through Maryland Partnership for Prevention, (MPP). Fill out the online consent form at <https://www.marylandvax.org/appointment/en/reg/0310962595>

- This is a secure, private site.
- Use your insurance card to fill out your insurance information. Your insurance company will be billed. There is no copay or deductible. You will NOT be charged by us or your insurance company.

If you register your child for a flu vaccine, PLEASE inform them! Passes will be distributed to the students the day before with a time for them to come to the auditorium. If your child has AM ARL and you completed a form for them to receive the vaccine, when they exit the bus, they are to go immediately to the Auditorium.

Students will not be called down if they do not appear. Maryland Partnership has a designated time appropriated for us before they move on to another school that day.

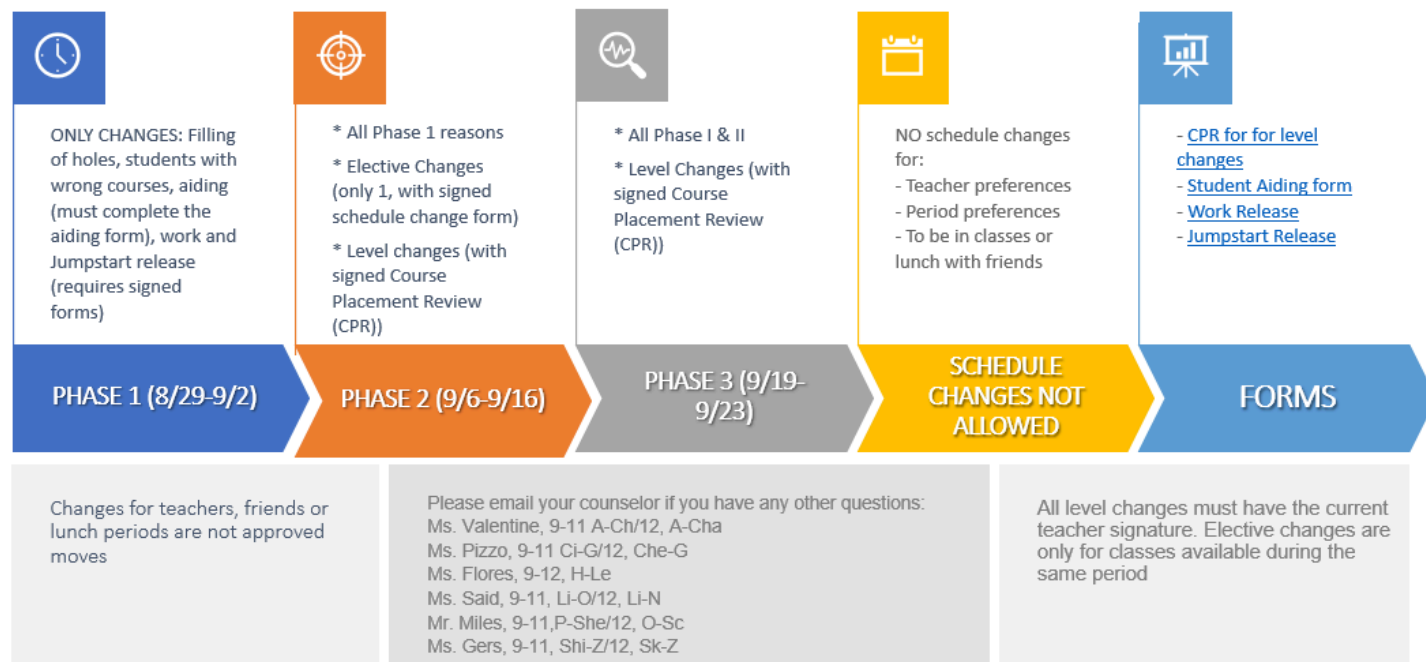
