We recently have been addressing an incident with another district that was directed towards one of our own players; we have expected the other district to take our concerns seriously. Unfortunately, we have received several reports from visiting communities regarding the nature of our hospitality at sporting events. Specifically, there have been troubling accounts that some of their student-athletes have been treated in undignified ways, including instances of body shaming and bigoted remarks by members of our student section.

As a collective community, we share and embody the values of kindness, tolerance, and good sportsmanship. Unfortunately, when a few isolated actions fall short of those values, it reflects on all of us. That is why it is so important that we approach this moment with a sense of collective responsibility. Mascenic has a proud tradition of school spirit, and I believe we can turn this into an opportunity to show the strength of our character. We must work together to make certain that our stands and sidelines reflect encouragement, pride, and welcome—so that every visitor leaves knowing the true spirit of our community.
