Current Events: News Analysis

Directions:

Understanding events in the news is an integral part of life. For this assignment, you will analyze a current and/or developing news event. The purpose of this assignment is to allow you an opportunity to practice the application of cultural and geographic knowledge throughout sixth grade. You are strongly encouraged to use as much content language as possible in your analysis. Your news analysis should be typed, 12-14 point Times New Roman, Arial or Cabin font, using the template <u>linked here</u>.

You will be graded on your clarity and depth of analysis. The news analysis should contain the following three parts.

Part I: Citation

Include a specific link to the original NewsELA article.

Part II: Summary

A summary of the events in the article. Think who, what, when, where, why, how? This must show a thorough understanding of the events in the article.

Part III: Analysis

Your analysis section may include your opinion of the event. *You are expected to reference the article specifically in your analysis. This writing piece should demonstrate careful analytical thinking.

Other Information:

- *Articles must be found on the "NewsELA" website, unless otherwise directed.
- *The topic of your selected article must rotate. For example, one week can be politics, another week can be about a global event, another week can be about sports, another week can be about science/technology, etc.
- *As long as you use the following format (linked above) as a template each week, and analyze to the best of your ability, you will receive a passing score each week.
