Article 4: Government Rules

- 3. Any elected or appointed official may designate a proxy to act on their behalf in case of absence.
 - a. No elected or appointed official may act as a proxy in any branch of government other than their own. No member of the Judicial branch may act as a proxy in any branch of government other than their own. Similarly, no member of a branch outside the Judiciary may act as a Judicial proxy.
 - b. No individual may concurrently proxy for more than one (1) person.
