How did how did that play a part in how you are handling things where you are now at Texas?

Let's expand on that. This this again. This is good in the game. That's the name of the podcast. Where did it. Where did it start. Where like how did it come together for you. That football would be your journey and that you would grow to find who you are and what your identity is and how it applies to the world around you and and how that plays a part in how you coach, you know, with the with your players and with your with your staff.

What's what's signature to. To Sarkisian. What. What is Coach Starks that this is this is me. Like this is what, I took from all those things you said. But this is my staple. This is this is this is me. This is who people are. They're going to take this from me, and they're going to say, you know what?

That's Coach Sarkisian.
Okay. Okay.
I like that. I like that.
I just met him. I just met him not too long ago. Yeah. He's tall. Right.
Yeah.
That's the perspective of it all. You know it's the perspective because tough all day. You gotta, you gotta take it as it comes. Like you said you got to make it do what it's going to do. Because ultimately you learn all those lessons real time. You get to measure it and quantify it, playing the game of football.
And that's what I love so much. And speaking of that, you guys have a guy that's on your coaching staff that's going into the College Football Hall of Fame to to be immortalized. And I'm I'm excited to be there to to welcome him in. Mike Huff safety big dog. Well, I mean, coming out of college, I mean, he was one of them them guys like you that that's that's my style of football, the way he played.
And it's great that he's getting that the honor and getting the the ability to be able to go in there. Talk to me a little bit about Mike. And then again talk to me a little bit about what the National Football Foundation, the education, the the things that go along with what's so important to to the foundational components of what the National Football Foundation represents.
All right, let's get it.

He's a bad mama jamma, bruh. This. I tell you what. And so are you. My guy. I'm. I was a fan. I was a fan from afar. Just living out here and hearing how high people spoke of you. But now I'm a fan from from close up, getting an opportunity to chop it up with you, man, I wish you all the best.

Wish you, wish you great luck in success. So, coach, I appreciate you taking some time out to give us some some nuggets and some some conversation about what's good in the game.
