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ABSTRACT

The title page should include the specific title, the authors, and an abstract of around 200 words at the beginning of the manuscript. The paper begins with a title which uses 14pt Times New Roman. This is followed by the details for each author in 11pt Times New Roman. A concise and factual abstract is required. The abstract must briefly present the context of the problem (background), the purpose/aims of the research, the methodology used, and the results and conclusions (contributions). Abstracts are often presented separately from articles and therefore need to stand on their own. Therefore references/citations should be avoided. In addition, non-standard or unusual abbreviations should be avoided, but should be defined where appropriate when first mentioned in this abstract.

Keywords: Up to six keywords should also be included, all in lower case, separated with coma (,)

1. Introduction

This article serves as a template for writing in the Journal of Research in Industrial Engineering and Management using MS Word. The paper should not include page numbering and may be written in either Bahasa Indonesia or English. The total number of pages should not exceed twelve (12), formatted in A4 single-sided paper.

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The journal structure should follow these main sections: 1. Introduction, 2. Research Methodology, 3. Result and Discussion, 4. Conclusion. In this introduction, please included: Sufficient background, problem context based on a literature review, research objectives, and originality (state of the art).

When citing works with more than three authors, use the main author's surname followed by et al. and the year of publication. Multiple citations should be ordered chronologically. Example: (Hare & O'Neill, 2000; Aron et al., 2019) at the end of a sentence. If mentioned at the beginning of a sentence: Stegmeir (2016) stated the following sentence.

2. Research Methodology

Please describe the methodology clearly and in detail so that readers or other researchers can reproduce similar methods. Provide references for published methodologies and include explanations for any methods that were developed specifically for this study.

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3. Result and Discussion

The results should be presented clearly and concisely. Emphasize the most significant findings first, followed by a discussion that explains the meaning and managerial insights of these results. If available, please provide adequate comparisons between your findings and previously published articles with similar research contexts.

Writing Mathematical Equations

Mathematical equations must be numbered sequentially, starting from (1) until the end of the paper. The numbering should appear in parentheses and be right-aligned. Insert one blank line before and after each equation. The equation size settings are as follows: Full = 11 pt, Subscript/Superscript = 8 pt, Sub-subscript/Superscript = 6 pt, Symbol = 12 pt, Sup-symbol = 10 pt. Use the Insert Equation feature and apply the math style.

Table and Figures

Tables and figures should be placed either at the top or bottom of a page; avoid placing them in the middle of text. Table titles should be placed above the table, while figure titles should be placed below the figure. Titles must be written in lowercase, except for the first letter of the first word of each sentence. All tables and figures must be numbered sequentially. Figures should be center-aligned, while tables should be left-aligned.

Table note should appear above the table.

Table 1. Table title is written with capitalization only at the beginning of the first word.

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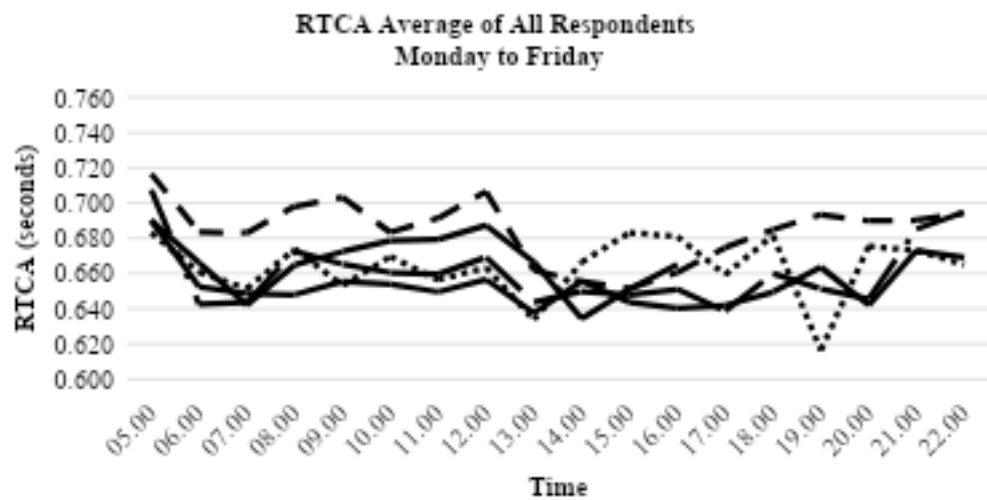


Figure 1. Use capital letters only at the beginning of the figure title, without a period at the end.

Figure 1: The figure caption should appear below the figure.

References to figures, tables, theorems, or lemmas must begin with a capital letter and should not include punctuation marks. For example, “Figure 1” and “Table 1” illustrate “Theorem 1.” All captions must use capitalization only for the first word. Figures and tables should be included within the body text and meet the quality standards for print publication. Frames around figures are not required.

Conclusion and Recommendations

The conclusion should be written in narrative form and not presented as a bullet or numbered list. Summarize the main findings, contributions, and implications of the study concisely.

Acknowledgement

Write acknowledgments here, if applicable.

References

References should be arranged alphabetically by the author’s last name and chronologically for works by the same author. Only include references that are cited in the main text. Do not include uncited references.

The Journal of Research in Industrial Engineering and Management adopts the APA Style for both in-text citations and the reference list. Authors are encouraged to use reference management software such as Mendeley to ensure consistency.
