### **Attendance:**

Attendance in CEC's distance learning program is defined as evidence of engaging with the assigned material and or participating in class discussions. While attendance is recorded in Aeries by the teacher of record, evidence of attendance can be measured in one of the following ways (including, but not limited to):

- · Google Check in forms

- · Questions to answer on Google Classroom
- · Participation in an online discussion
- · Class participation during the scheduled class time

# **Departmental Support:**

Classes at Compton Early College are offered with one goal in mind, to help students achieve their dream of attending college. Our courses are aligned with <u>A-G course requirements</u> for graduation. Students who fall behind in these courses are in jeopardy of not meeting their A-G requirements and more importantly, becoming ineligible for graduation. Teachers have compiled a detailed list/guide for students to follow that will allow students a pathway to success in each department and the working knowledge parents need to support them.

# **English Department:**

Methods to reach/support chronically absent students and supporting those who are struggling

English Teachers will...

- Record Zoom sessions and post them in the assignment section of Google Classroom. Students who are absent can come back at any time to review the lessons they missed.
- Make pre-recorded videos for special topics available to students.
- Communicate with students via Google Classroom and parents via ParentSquare.
- Provide extra office hours.
- Communicate both synchronously and asynchronously to meet them where they're at.
- Makes multiple attempts to connect with their parents throughout the year.

- Offer students the possibility to turn in late work to earn a passing grade ( students must email teacher immediately and ask which assignments they can turn in late to earn a *C*. To help pace their progress and ensure late assignments are completed with fidelity, students are limited to turning in 2 per week.
- Provide students with the opportunity to <u>meet with the teacher</u> after class for questions, clarification, or help.
- Conduct one on one meetings with selected students (those who are struggling or chronically absent) to discuss their specific situations and design an action plan that will help them meet the learning goals.
- Grant extended deadlines to students who are able to complete assignments but have difficulties meeting deadlines.
- Provides modified assignments/ reduced workload for students who are simply overwhelmed with the current class expectations (in this instance, students are only
- required to complete key assignments to demonstrate mastery of standards being covered; they are excused from all other intermediary assignments)
- Offer tutoring sessions during periods 7 and 8 to allow students to complete their missing assignments on the spot so they will not have to worry about them after school.
- Make phone calls to parents of students who are missing in action or those who are not completing work.
- Provide Google phone numbers to parents so they may contact teachers periodically to check on the progress of their children.
- Paper Tutoring Services are available on demand. This 24/7 service allows for students to get 1-on-1 help in any content area inclusive of college level and AP level work.

# **Math Department:**

In an effort to reach/support chronically absent students and those who are struggling in math,

Math Teachers will...

- Accept late work. Late work will not be penalized more than 20%.
- Offer tutoring services:
  - a. Additional support via Zoom is offered on a weekly basis. This means having Zoom sessions outside of regularly scheduled class hours for students needing

- additional support. This tutoring takes place between 1-2 hours per week. These sessions should be scheduled with individual math teachers
- b. <u>Paper Tutoring Services</u> are available on demand. This 24/7 service allows for students to get 1-on-1 help in any content area inclusive of college level and AP level work. Students can screenshot problems and have a tutor help them step-by-step. Students can access Paper through their classlink account. - Continue to develop individual plans with students on a case by case basis to meet each unique situation accordingly.
- Inform students of the individual conditions necessary to improve their grades.
- Paper Tutoring Services are available on demand. This 24/7 service allows for students to get 1-on-1 help in any content area inclusive of college level and AP level work. # Foreign Language & Studio Art:

#### • Communication:

Students should communicate with the teacher about what is going on with their lives on the multiple platforms they can reach the teacher on, so that they can continuously practice with them the skills of patience, resilience, and flexibility in the face of life's challenges.

### • Participation:

Participation is the cornerstone of both the Chinese and Art classes. #### • Homework:

Given the strenuous nature and overwhelming course load of online work, students are given a flexible timeline of a week for a due date. For instance an assignment will be given the time frame of 02/01/2021-02/05/2021 to be turned in, or 5 school days to turn in. Again, we are practicing and understanding that flexibility is key.

### **Science Department**

In an effort to reach/support chronically absent students and those who are struggling in math,

Science Teachers will...

- Provide students the opportunity to submit missing work.
- Office hours will be offered for students to have one on one conversations, conferences, and tutoring sessions with teachers.
- Develop individual plans with students on a case by case basis to meet situations accordingly
- Teachers will provide asynchronous opportunities for students to get themselves caught up on
  missed material. These opportunities might include teachers providing recordings of their lessons,
  copies of class notes, and recordings of difficult assignment instructions. These will be left in
  Google Classroom for all students to access as necessary.
- Paper Tutoring Services are available on demand. This 24/7 service allows for students to get 1-on-1 help in any content area inclusive of college level and AP level work. Students can submit written assignments and have a tutor help them. Students can access Paper through their classlink account.
