

After ITC is over for the day, you may want to have some fun! Here are some suggestions:

On the Stanford campus:

- On Thursday evening we will have a board game night in the CS department! RSVP here: <https://forms.gle/xMhcf2P87iPbpKq4A> (We will post/announce more details, like the exact location, closer to the event).
- Here's a link to some self-guided walking tours: <https://visit.stanford.edu/explore-campus/> The "self-guided tour of Stanford gardens" is especially nice.
- Hike "the dish"! This is a paved walking trail (about 5k long, plus some walking to get there) that goes up to a radio telescope and has some great views of the bay. <https://dish.stanford.edu/> The trail closes at 7:30pm, so there should be time for a post-ITC hike on Thursday or Friday.¹
- The Cantor Arts Center: <https://museum.stanford.edu/> Unfortunately the museum closes at 5pm so you probably won't be able to make it after ITC, but there's a Rodin sculpture garden outside the museum that's worth a visit any time of day. (Also it's a good option if you are still around on Saturday morning).

In downtown Palo Alto:

- Go on a boba tea / ice cream crawl on University Ave! Examples of destinations include T4, Bober Tea, Tong Sui, Kung Fu Tea, Gong Cha, Mr. Sun Tea, SomiSomi, Scoop, Salt and Straw... (All within just a few blocks of each other).
- For dinner, there are lots of restaurants on University Ave and on California Ave.²
- Wednesday night is trivia night at [The Patio](#) (7pm). And if you are here the night before ITC starts, Tuesdays at 8pm is trivia night at the [Rose and Crown](#). (And on the other days, both will sell you beer and mediocre pub food, if not trivia.³)
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¹ The dish opens at 6am if you want to go on an early morning run!
