Daily Attendance Procedures at a Glance

- Parent/guardian...notify the office by 8:00am of any absence, late arrival or early dismissal
- Student...check in/out of the office if you arrived late or will be leaving early
- Office Secretary...connect with home by phone and Infinite Campus to communicate absences
- Classroom Teacher...submit timely and accurate attendance
- Administration...connect, communicate and collaborate

Additional Information:

- The school day begins at 8:20 and ends at 3:35 (unless posted otherwise)
- Classes meet for 65 minute periods
 - Arrive less than 10 minutes late = tardy
 - o Arrive more than 10 minutes late = absent
- Attendance to all scheduled periods is required (including classroom, online, TAS/ADV)
- A student must be in school on the day of performance, practice, scheduled contest, program, or trip if they wish to participate. Students must be in attendance no later than 9:45 AM. Any exception must be cleared by the High School Principal or the High School Activities Director prior to the absence.

-ATTENTION-

A student is considered to be "chronically absent" if they miss 10% of the days in a grading period.

By lowa Code, both excused and unexcused absences count towards the total days

used to determine if a student is chronically absent. Absences that are exempt include: those Directed by Administration, Algona High School Sponsored Activities and Events, Bereavement (funeral), College Visits, Court Appointments and Doctor's Excuse (which recommend student absence).

Change beginning 2024-2025

ACSD Board Policy 501.09 (as directed by Iowa Code)

4 absences (10%)...a certified letter will be sent home detailing information related to the absences and any consequence for additional absences 6 absences (15%)...an engagement meeting will be held to identify barriers to attendance and interventions to develop strategies to improve 8 absences (20%)...a call will be made to the County Attorney and more strict measures may be taken

ATTENDANCE

Missing a day of school here and there may not seem like much, but absences add up!
