Nursing assessment for signs and symptoms, writing SOAP notes. 6. Patient's admission procedure and writing patient's details/filling out assessment forms 7. Physical examination for vital sign and filling out the assessment form for vital signs 8. Pain assessment and pain's sign and symptoms-related vocabularies 9. Medication and medical supplies terminologies, giving instructions to patients related to medication, explaining medication's labels and possible side effects, medication's form and prescription. 10. Personal care; patient hygiene, activity daily living and wound care management 11. Elimination's pattern, organs, and problems 12. Nutritional status, food and beverages in hospital, measurement and quantities, food allergies, and giving advice for diet. 13. Patient's discharge plan and appointment.
