- the IHS-PDE Career Readiness Skills-Social Emotional-Learning Steering committee met with various stakeholders to review information including recent teacher self-assessment survey results and identify areas of need to goal setting and action planning. Faculty members include S. Juart, E. Brocious, K. Manning, Tara Pangonis, Katie Smith, Jonelle Dongilla, and Donny Bowers, and Doug and me. Additionally, we have representatives on the steering committee that includes students, business, parents, ICTC, Adelphoi Village, IUP, and Indiana County Chamber of Commerce.
- Eric Brocious and Donny Bowers and Mr. McElheny will travel to PDE to participate in a panel-type of presentation regarding our efforts and goals of the IHS- PDE Career Readiness - Social and Emotional Learning Pilot program of which IHS is part.
- S. Juart, E. Brocious, T. Pangonis, K. Manning, K. Smith, and K. Stants, D.Johnson and I, will again attend the Indiana County Manufacturing Consortium meeting to meet, discuss, and network with industry professionals to discuss and share perspectives to assist with meeting the needs of our students and the local economy. We appreciate the willingness and efforts of faculty to demonstrate the level of care and dedication that our school has to help its students to contribute to meet the economic needs of our county and region.
- We will have guests from IU 8 to visit IHS to tour our pre-engineering facilities and speak with some of our STEM teachers and students. In the afternoon, Keaton Stants, Mark Rend, and Mike Lehman will tour the new IUP College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics that will become the John J. and Char Kopchick College of Natural Sciences and Mathematics. Such an opportunity will help these STEM teachers share with colleagues the great learning opportunities provided to our students and gain additional focus and connection for post-secondary studies of students.
- We will conduct our second, "Career, College, and Employment Readiness" activity using a modified, in-house, two-hour delay schedule. Thank you for the many positive comments regarding its value and function to better prepare our students for post-secondary endeavors. We appreciate the feedback of faculty regarding electronic access and operation of the software program. Our immediate objective is for juniors and seniors to compete a minimum requirement of 8 activities for the 2019-2020 school year. Freshmen and sophomores will progress their efforts at a more deliberate and learned pace. Career Readiness was a measurement of which we fell short for FRPI.
- On January 16, at the start of the second semester, Sarah Juart will formally begin her responsibilities as our IHS Career Readiness Coordinator. She will perform three primary responsibilities in such role: A. Establish, strengthen and sustain contacts with business/industry professionals to develop working partnerships for our students to engage in on-site visits, job shadowing, and internship opportunities; B. Promote career readiness within our school and community to students, staff, and faculty and to our community at large utilizing all forms of print and electronic media; and, C. Assist school counselors, faculty, and students to ensure that juniors and seniors meet or exceed minimum requirements of completing 8 career readiness artifacts via Smart Futures or other-approved types of artifacts by the end of the 2019-2020 school year.

On Monday, January 20, our next in-service day, it is proposed that IHS faculty will
participate in Career Readiness-Social and Emotional Learning informational activities
regarding the three primary areas of PA Career Readiness, including Self-Awareness
and Self-Management, Establishing and Maintaining Relationships, and Social
Problem-Solving Skills. IHS teachers, school counselors, and business/industry
professionals, and other relevant individuals will provide information to help IHS to better
understand the goals and outcomes of the primary areas of Social and Emotional
Learning in the context and support of career readiness. Members of our IHS-PDE
CRS-SEL team will plan and coordinate the activities.

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
