

The Security Council,

Recalling its previous resolutions, including resolutions 825, 1695, 1718, 1875, 1887, 2270, 2321, 2356, 2371, 2375 and 2397, concerning the need for nuclear disarmament on the Korean Peninsula,

Reaffirming the need for all countries to abide by the terms of the Nuclear Non-Proliferation Treaty,

Expressing grave concern at the repercussions the Democratic People's Republic of Korea's nuclear program for peace on the Korean peninsula,

Highlighting the importance of a return to negotiations and the need for a compromise to achieve lasting change,

Understanding the relevance of building an orderly relationship built on trust and transparency,

1. **Condemns** the ballistic missile test of 7 April 2018 conducted by the Democratic People's Republic of Korea (DPRK) in the Sea of Japan;
2. **Reaffirms** its previous order to the DPRK to cease all development of weapons of mass destruction, including but not limited to nuclear, radiological, chemical and biological agents;
3. **Reaffirms** all extant military and economic sanctions imposed on the DPRK by this Council;
4. **Directs** the United Nations Office for Disarmament Affairs to create an impartial, supervisory, and consultative body known as the Coordinative Council on Missile Tests (CCMT) to be the mediator and coordinator between DPRK and its neighbors in regards to future missile tests;
5. **Orders** the government of the DPRK to give seven days' prior notice to the CCMT before the launch of any ballistic or nuclear-capable missile outside the internationally-recognized sovereign territory or waters of the DPRK;
6. **Declares** that the creation of the CCMT is by nature a practical reaction to the situation on the Korean peninsula and does not constitute recognition or approval of the unlawful ballistic missile tests by the DPRK;
7. **Directs** the Under-Secretary-General of Disarmament Affairs to report any violations of the CCMT framework to the Council for further deliberation and enforcement action;
8. **Decides** to work towards restarting negotiations for the disarmament of the Korean peninsula in return for the eventual abrogation of sanctions against the DPRK within the framework of the Six Party Talks;

9. **Decides** to remain actively seized on the issue.
