So while students have until January 1 to submit application materials, everything needs to be in order before we go on winter break on December 21. Students are encouraged to see me with any questions about their applications, or if they need letters of recommendation from me or any of their other teachers. I am happy to help select colleges to apply to, read over essays, or review application materials. If students have not completed everything they need by December 21, there's no guarantee that we'll be able to access the document they'll need for their application during the break when teachers are away from school, so it is critical that if you child is planning on applying to a US school that we first check the deadline, and if it is January 1, that they see me before the break.



Digital Art PAWS Bangkok Booth

Every year, our Graphic Design / Digital Art class does a charity box unit. We create a campaign and fundraise for our cause. This year, students chose to support PAWS Bangkok. In order to help support this charity, students ran a fundraising booth during the Halloween Carnival. Students

raised approximately 3,200 baht in just under two hours with a Feed the Kitty game. All prizes were donated to ensure 100% of what was raised went directly to the charity. It is wonderful that this yearly unit provides a chance to learn design but also help impact our community in a positive way.





Advanced Art

Students in Advanced Art had their lino carving skills refreshed this month. By student vote, everyone created a botanical based composition and transferred it to their lino blocks. Students were careful to follow safe carving procedures as they rendered their designs while considering line direction and qualities. Currently, students are finishing up their carving and doing test prints to see what last details need to be added. Once students finish carving their blocks, they will create multiple versions of their art on the printpress with a variety of inks.









Intro Painting

Intro Painting students kicked off their large still life unit by working together to create strong object compositions. Students chose each item while considering size, texture, shape and balance. Students found their own individual compositions and then rendered their drawing on canvas. Students were encouraged to alter their color schemes to analogous colors and include significant brushwork. As students worked, they built up their colors. Paintings are still in the creation process and should be finished in a few more classes.

Students continued on with their normal learning during online learning.

Students were provided with acrylic paint and brushes so they could continue painting at home.







Art 1

Art 1 students spent the month creating their very first lino block based print. Students voted and chose to focus on insects. To encourage Lifelong Learning, each student researched three different insects before deciding which one to render. This allowed students to connect art with science in an authentic way. Once they had their insect drawing done, they altered their compositions' negative space areas to create more movement.

Students learned basic carving skills and safety. As they worked, students were careful to utilize their bench hooks for an extra layer of safety.

Digital Art

This month, students have been working on unique charity donation boxes for PAWS Bangkok. Students have been encouraged to use the skills they acquired in previous units to make donation boxes that are functional but eye-catching. Students have also been making mock accessories that could promote further fundraising for this charity. Students will print their boxes and create prototypes for actual use when they are finished. Teachers will be given a Google Form where they can select which box they would like to have in their classrooms to assist in collecting funds for this worthy charitable cause next month.

For our days of online learning, students loaded Adobe Illustrator onto their personal computers and did simple tutorials that were fun, creative and helpful to their skill base.

Art 8

Art 8 students have been working on their group bird composition.

Students researched birds to connect art and science, but also to choose birds that were suitable for a tree.

Students collaborated to decide the compositional grid for their group project and then worked together to form the tree that was included on each individual work of art. Students did preliminary work to explore different techniques to render their



birds, create individual leaves, texture branches, render foliage and finally a soft sky. As they worked, students collaborated together and utilized peer critique to help create a united group art piece. We expect to finish this multi-technique group project before the Christmas holidays.








Below, you'll see a list of the student's courses, recent scores, and attendance. Please note that you can change the Quarter you're viewing.



Clicking on "School" you can view the student's class schedule, their most recent report card, and their attendance details.









If you click "Schedule" (bottom of screen) you'll see the student's daily schedule




Choosing "Progress" will show you recent assignments


Computer Policy for 2021-22

Hair Color Requirement at the TCIS

It is a requirement that students at the TCIS maintain their natural hair color. Other colors (including highlights, shading, etc.) are not acceptable. While students enjoy trying new things in Secondary School, hair color is not one of those things that we allow students to experiment with.

Section 5.4-2 (page 29) of the Student Parent Handbook (Uniform and Appearance) regarding hair color:

Hairstyles, if considered inappropriate for students in a school setting, will not be allowed. Hair, even if colored, should be of natural hair color or hue.

Hair Styles Not Permitted at TCIS for Students from PK2 to Grade 12

Images such as lightning bolts are not shaved into a student's hair.(Example: Image 1) **Hair must be kept as the student's natural color.** Dyed, highlighted, bleached, or colored hair is not permitted at TCIS. (Examples: Images 2 & 3)

Excused Absences

For an Absence to be Excused, a parent must email/call in the absence within 24 hours. The reason for the absence must be supported by the factors outlined in the attendance policy:

- Illness with medical documentation
- observation or celebration of a religious holiday
- recovery from accident with medical documentation
- required court attendance with court notice
- death in the family
- other absences that may be deemed acceptable by the Head of Schools or Designee

Unexcused Absences

If a parent does not email/call in the absence, the student is marked as absent without excuse.
