- Assignment due dates and times will be posted for all assignments in your Google Classroom and on the assignment board in the back of the classroom.
- **EXAMS & QUIZZES** will be taken online (in most cases). If you are absent on the day of the Exam it is your responsibility to notify me upon your return so that you can take the Make-up Exam. Make-up Exams will be given in a different format on different days, but will cover the same information and adhere to the same time limits.
- If you are absent it is your responsibility to check the Google Classroom site so that you stay caught up with all assignments. Anything turned in after the assigned due date and time will be considered late.
- LATE WORK: Every effort should be made to avoid turning in work late because it causes both the student and the teacher to get behind. That being said, extenuating circumstances do arise and the teacher will make accommodations when appropriate; however, it is the student's responsibility to make the teacher aware of any situations that might prevent them from turning in their assignments on time. If there are no extenuating circumstances, late assignments will be lowered one grade for everyday they are late (This includes weekends; and nothing will be accepted after the 5th day). An assignment is considered late if it is turned in any time after the assigned due date and time. Any assignment turned in late after it has already been corrected, or if the answers have been discussed in class; can only receive half of the maximum score allowed (this will be adjusted down for each day it is late).
- No late work is accepted in the final week of each semester. If you are struggling to turn something in on time or have questions about this policy, please email the teacher to discuss. Remember all assignments can be turned in ONLINE through your Google Classroom if you are not present in class. This will allow you forgo late penalties
- Once work is turned in it is final. It can't be resubmitted for a higher grade.
- Extra-credit is NEVER given in lieu of missed assignments.
