INTRODUCTION (Times New Roman 12, Bold, Spasi 1)

Authors need to pay attention when making the introduction. In this section, IJBS: International Journal of Islamic Boarding School requires authors to organize the introduction into four paragraphs as follows:

First paragraph: Explain the problem or the reasons why the research is important, a maximum of 160 words.

Second paragraph: Explain the trend map and categorization of previous research (for example, 3-4 maps/large groups), as well as explain aspects or dimensions that have not been studied in the research. Maximum 160 words.

Third paragraph: Explain the purpose of the research, namely filling the gap or empty space (research gap) that has not been filled by previous researchers. It should be a maximum of 160 words.

Fourth paragraph: explains the argument to be proven (for qualitative research) or the hypothesis to be tested (for quantitative research), maximum of 160 words. (The writing format used is Constantia size 12 with one spacing).

RESEARCH METHODS (Times New Roman 12, Bold, Spasi 1)

This section explains the research methods used, such as (1) research approach and type, (2) Research Design, (2) population and sample (research objectives), (3) data collection techniques and instrument development, (4) and research data analysis techniques. If there is a statistical formula that the author uses as part of the research method, then the general procedure used should not be written. This strategy section explains if the researcher sets certain conditions for collecting and analyzing research data. Authors are advised to submit reference sources for the methods used.

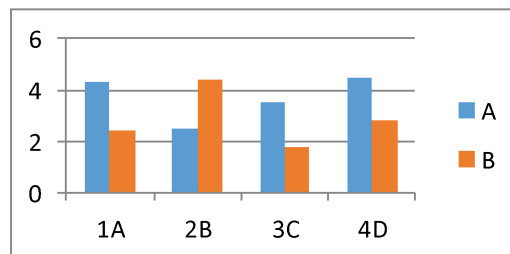
RESULTS AND DISCUSSION(Times New Roman 12, Bold, Spasi 1)

For qualitative research, the results section contains a detailed section in the form of subtopics that are directly related to the research focus and category. (Constantia 12, Space 1)

Discussion (Times New Roman 12, Bold, Spasi 1)

Here, the author needs to compare the findings with existing literature, analyze whether the research results are by previously stated theories or hypotheses, and explore the implications of the findings. The author also needs to explain the limitations of this study and how these limitations may affect the results or generalization of the findings. In addition, the discussion should lead to a discussion of the relevance of the findings to theory or practical applications, as well as suggestions for further research. This section is an opportunity to dig deeper into the results' meaning and provide a broader view of the topic being studied.

CONCLUSIONS (Times New Roman 12, Bold, Spasi 1)

The conclusion summarizes the study's main findings and provides recommendations or suggestions for further research. The author should emphasize the study's contribution to the relevant field and explain its implications. If there are practical recommendations, these should be clearly stated, as well as suggestions for future research, either to extend the study or to address existing limitations.
