Technical Set Up Plan

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1) Details

It's important to know what are the types of work you will be setting up (eg. Wall, Floor, Pedestal) & the equipments needed beforehand.

Note: For Lighting

- This may not be applicable if your work have no specific lighting required
 - Eg. A light work may need a dark room, therefore require black out curtains to block out the space in the gallery.
- Spotlights in the gallery are limited.
 - o For my batch, each person had 3-4 each, so 2-3 works may share one spotlight


2) Set Up Level of Difficulty

 - o Eg. By Day 1, I aim to have Artworks 1-5 all on the wall
 - o Eg. By 3pm, I aim to hang up all the paintings & set up the projector
