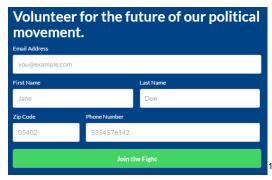
2 minute elevator pitch

Meet Fannie and Fred.

Fannie and Fred don't know each other, but they live in the same town, and they both are actively thinking about, reading about, and discussing with their friends the issue of voting rights and voter suppression in their state.

Finally, Fannie and Fred have had it, they are tired of reading, liking, and commenting on posts over Facebook and retweeting clever tweets. They each start looking up organizations they heard are doing amazing work, and looking for a way to get involved and take action. And we've all been there, hitting the pervasive online Wall of Generic Form!!!:

Everywhere they go, it's the same **damn form** and the same process to follow. They each sign up and they are solicited by a webpage for donations and have more email lists to unsubscribe from. Fannie and Fred's emails are put into a central database and are sent emails from the center. When **what Fannie and Fred really want to do is meet each other so that they can organize and work towards collective people-powered action in their community.** Fannie, Fred, and even the organization who put up that damn form are losing out on **powerful network effects of organizing**. Swimmy is the tool to connect Fannie and Fred and facilitate forming relationships built on shared commitment to organize their community.

30 second elevator pitch

Project Swimmy connects individual activists with local organizing groups, creating an online organizing community. Activists can easily find groups near them by causes, such as racial injustice, women's rights, and income inequality. Instantly activists and group members can meet virtually and organize for collective actions such as: calling elected representatives, going door to door to discuss issues in their community, registering voters, and organizing a local campaign to elect progressive representatives. Project Swimmy provides groups the resources to recruit volunteers, and trainings and tools to successfully organize their community.

Mission statement

Project Swimmy exists to enable, through technology, people who are confronting the need for change to collectively organize. Swimmy aims to build power in communities by bringing people together in groups and building on coalitions of groups and intersection of issues.

Minimum Viable Product (MVP)

Why the name Swimmy? - Swimmy is from the children's book <u>Swimmy by Leo Lionni</u>. In the story, the protagonist Swimmy is a small black fish alone in the ocean constantly being pushed around by larger fish. He later finds a school of red fish and they organize to form a giant fish, in which Swimmy is the eye, and together they are no longer chased by big fish. Swimmy has long been an iconic symbol of organizing to gain collective political power that represents the people and not the few.

Values

Project Swimmy is as much of a technology project as an organizing project. We exist to enable grassroots organizers who are fighting against injustice, bigotry, fear, and division. Below are our values that we expect all leaders using Swimmy to abide by:

- We support the struggles of injustice faced by marginalized people and promote their involvement and leadership in the movement including black communities, brown communities, native and first nation communities, women, LGBTQ, immigrant, migrant, and refugees, workers and laborers.

- We strive for democracy and a political system that works for all people with transparency and accountability.
- We practice dismantling the systems of oppression including white supremacy, racial caste systems, patriarchy, heteronormativity, imperialism, ableism, ageism, and all their intersections.
- We believe in supporting the struggle for racial, gender, economic, and environmental justice.
- We believe in the right to practice religion and the right to not practice religion. We believe in interfaith solidarity *** ugh this needs work
- We believe in continuous learning through continuous constructive feedback.
- We believe organizing is a practice of leadership based on relationship building, story telling, strategizing, action, and structure.
