Submission Categories

Scholars and practitioners are invited to submit abstracts that are original, completed at the time of submission, not submitted to another journal and/or presented at other conference in the following categories:

- Research includes submissions related to research studies and scholarship grounded in theories/approaches/philosophies related to Play.
- **Teaching** includes submissions that advance scholarship of teaching, curriculum and pedagogy related to Play in fashion and related fields.
- Concept includes submissions related to broad view of the field that may be position papers, emerging philosophies/schools of thought, practitioner and action-oriented strategies advancing Play in fashion, systematic literature reviews, bibliometric analyses and interconnectedness of policy, research, and practice. Submissions in this category must be supported by thorough synthesis and analyses of diverse and reliable sources of information to inform future scholarship and actions.
- **Creative Design** Submissions in this category include original design work focused on play.

If accepted, the study/design must be presented/displayed by at least one of the original abstract authors in an oral/poster/display format. The presenting author must register for the symposium by March 8, 2024, to allow the organizing committee time to prepare and disseminate the Symposium Program.
