

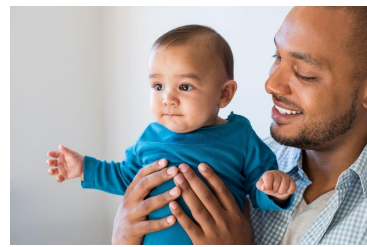
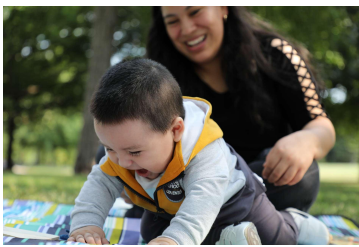

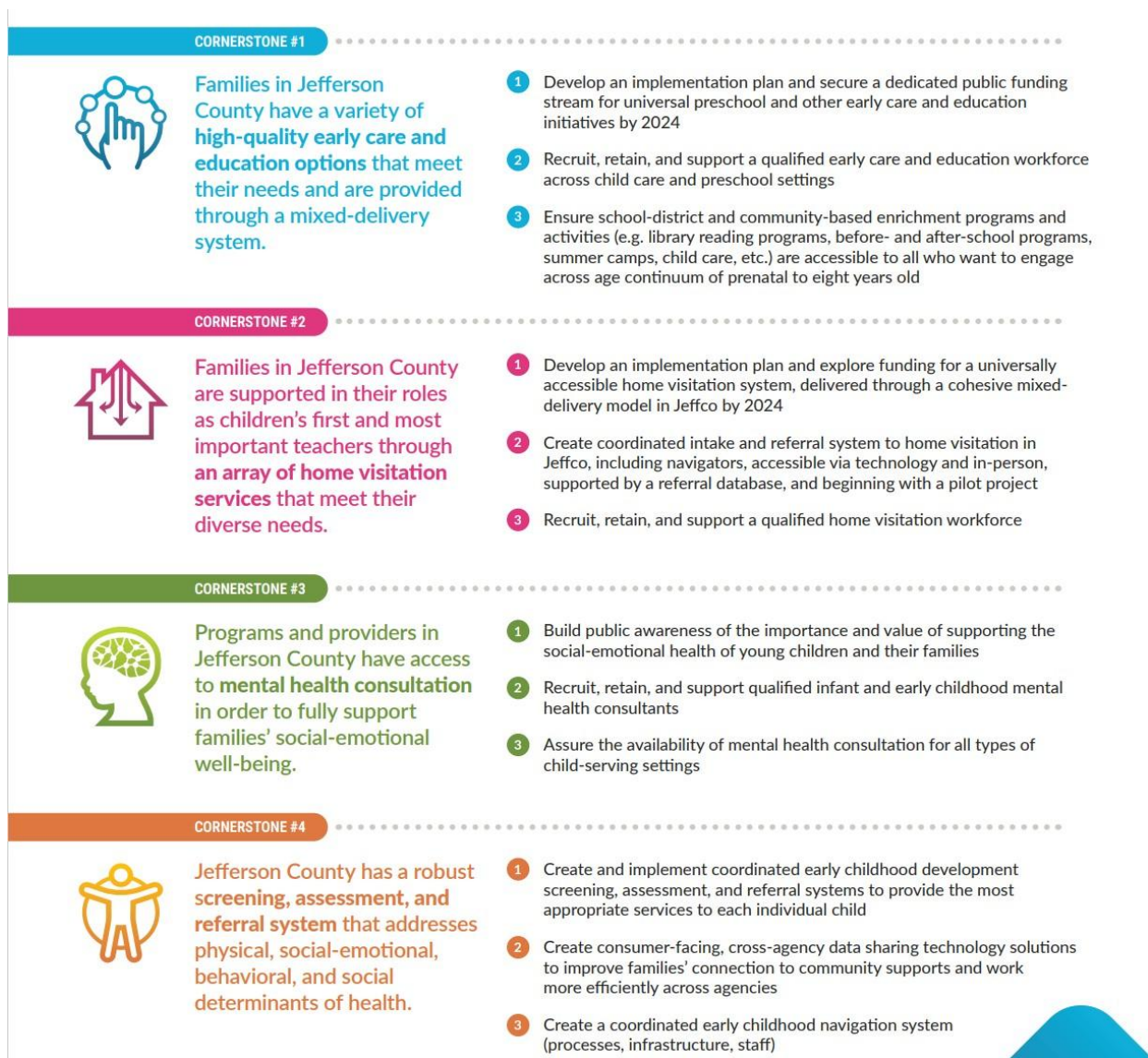

Detailed Service Description: The Family Navigation Team connects families to the resources, support and information that they need. The Family Navigation team serves as a single-entry point for Jeffco families with young children. A brief assessment helps to identify family needs and a tailored referral is made to home visiting programs *and* resources to address basic needs.

Goals:

- Reduce the complexity involved for providers and families in navigating the home visiting landscape
- Ensure goodness of fit between families and home visiting programs
- Increase the visibility and utilization of home visiting programs in Jeffco
- Increase access to community resources to support basic needs, such as diapers, clothing, food, housing, and financial assistance.

Detailed Program Description: Alma is a free community, peer-delivered program that provides home visits to families or caregivers who are expecting or until their children are 3 years old. Alma is offered to families in different languages from cultural experiences; Spanish, English and Somali..

Families who participate in the home visitation program receive 7 to 10 home visits with a member of the Alma team. The home visits can be arranged as frequently as needed, usually once a week or every other week. Home visits include:

- Learning and practicing the Alma skills for parents and caregivers to engage in activities that promote wellbeing.
- Connecting to resources in the community.
- Supporting parent-child relationships through activities with little ones, problem-solving, educational materials, and other opportunities.

Families are invited to join Alma Kids (playgroup), Cafecitos, monthly events, classes, Circles of Security series, Circles of Healings, and volunteering opportunities. Alma has free diapers and clothing distributions every Tuesday from 11 am to 2 pm.

Detailed Program Description: Colorado Community Health Alliance (CCHA) is the regional organization that administers physical and behavioral health benefits for members enrolled in Health First Colorado (Colorado’s Medicaid program) in Boulder, Broomfield, Clear Creek, El Paso, Gilpin, Jefferson, Park and Teller counties.

CCHA coordinates care to help members access the health services and supports they need. Care coordinators work with members, their primary care providers and caregivers to develop care plans and connect members to medical, behavioral health and community services.

CCHA also helps address social drivers of health, connecting members to community resources for needs such as food, housing, transportation, utilities, and other supportive services.

Detailed Program Description: Cuenta Conmigo Coop is an inclusive group focused on maternal and child health that supports and strengthens families, communities and organizations to achieve health and well-being for all. We offer services from and for the community, creating a safe and reliable space focused on the whole family and responding to their cultural needs. Cuenta Conmigo counselors are nationally certified and have direct experience working with the Latina community. We focus on infant and toddler nutrition, infant mental health, and community navigation of resources.

- FREE 1-1 support in person, phone, or virtual. Expectant families can schedule 3 visits ahead of time – for support in pregnancy, right after birth, and a few weeks later. We have breast pumps and supplies to help families have what they need to welcome their new baby into the world.
- Community and personalized groups for families (face-to-face and virtual). Four locations: Arvada, Edgewater, Southwest Denver, and Zoom.
- We offer community and professional trainings on infant and toddler nutrition, child development, breastfeeding and lactation, and community emergency preparedness training. We offer the Breastfeeding Friendly Child Care Certification for in-home childcare providers and support their continuing education.

Cuenta Conmigo also offers consulting services for organizations, including research and data analysis to inform programming and support families more effectively.

Detailed Program Description: DDRC is the Local EI Program (LEIP) that provides Early Intervention (EI) services in Jefferson, Gilpin, Clear Creek and Summit counties in Colorado. Colorado's EI program provides supports and services to children with developmental delays or disabilities and their families from birth until the child's third birthday.

EI Colorado services look different for each family depending on each child's needs and each family's goals. Services can be provided by a variety of specialists, such as speech-language pathologists, physical therapists, occupational therapists, developmental intervention providers, social-emotional providers, vision providers, nutrition providers or audiology providers. EI helps families and caregivers learn ways to support and promote their child's development within their everyday routines and activities. Services are provided in a child's natural environment (as long as the natural environment is in one of the counties assigned to that EIP) and are delivered via parent/caregiver coaching by the EI provider.

Outcomes and services are based on the family's concerns and priorities and address how their child relates to others, learns new things and gets their needs met. The Early Intervention Colorado program bases its foundation of support on seven guiding key principles. These principles are the foundation for how services are provided and delivered to the families supported in our program. They include being family-centered, focusing on children's learning in their natural environment, adult learning and quality teaming.

Process: Referral-Evaluation-Eligibility Determination-Development of Service Plan (IFSP) if child was found eligible.

Eligible families receive a weekly visit from a certified Parent Educator who supports the parent in becoming their child's first and best teacher. Using the Parents as Teachers model combined with a Montessori approach, our Parent Educators actively partner with families to ensure children are healthy, safe, and ready for school. This program is 100% free for eligible families and serves families prenatal through age five.

- Weekly 90-min, in-person visits are conducted with a certified Parent Educator

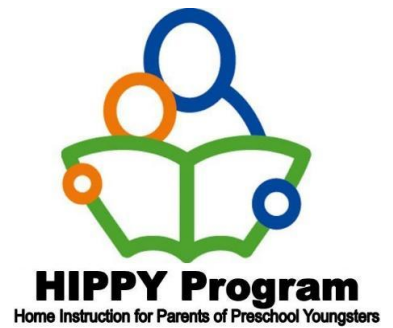

Detailed Program Description: HIPPY is a free school readiness program in English and Spanish that supports and involves parents in preparing their preschool age children for success in school and beyond. HIPPY can serve families whether or not their child attends preschool. Trained home visitors meet with parents once a week during the school year. They role play the curriculum together and then parents do the HIPPY activities with their children. HIPPY provides the activity packets, books and required materials to families, as well as a school readiness assessment and a parenting interactions checklist. Additionally, families are invited to free, fun, and informative monthly group meetings. Jeffco HIPPY is accredited through HIPPY USA.

Detailed Program Description: Nayacare is a medical, home health clinic radically changing how postpartum care is delivered. By focusing on the dyad (mom & newborn), Nayacare recognizes that mom/baby's health are still intertwined despite physical separation of birth. Our visits are 60-75 minutes providing complete newborn medical care, physical and mental health screening for mothers, feeding sessions with lactation included, and an emphasis on reducing harm and promoting safe sleep for our families. All this is conducted at our patients home ensuring accessibility to evidence based medical care. We take Medicaid, have a sliding scale, and prices are listed on our website. We currently do not take private insurance.

Detailed Program Description: NFP is a national, evidenced-based program that partners Registered Nurses with first-time pregnant people from pregnancy until the child's second birthday. NFP is an intensive long-term home visitation program. RNs complete home visits approximately twice a month and focus on: pregnancy and parenting education, birth planning, assessments (physical and mental health), child growth and development, weight checks, community resources and referrals, client life goals, etc. Studies show those who complete the program have: lower ER use for childhood injuries and accidental poisonings, lower rates of child abuse, lower rates of incarceration of children at the age of 15, and the moms tend to space pregnancies further apart. The Nurse-Family Partnership has been enrolling moms in Colorado for over 20 years.

Detailed Program Description: Parents As Teachers (PAT) is a free home-visit program dedicated to offering guidance, support and resources to families, from prenatal to age 3, through Jeffco Public Schools. Our Parent Educators collaborate closely with each family to foster meaningful connections, ensuring the success and well-being of both the children and the entire family unit. The PAT program follows an evidence based curriculum to ensure the best results for every child enrolled.

PAT offers monthly personalized visits when our Parent Educators meet the families either in person or virtually to provide a range of services, including:

- Offering opportunities for families to engage in learning activities with their child
- Conducting child assessments to track progress
- Providing referrals to community resources that meet the family's needs
- Creating a safe space for families to share insight about their child's development as well as other concerns
- Collaborating with families to set meaningful goals for the future

Other information: Group Connections are a monthly gathering for all families, either currently enrolled or on the waitlist, to come together to learn about topics regarding child development, complete a craft as a family, or just connect with other families in the program!

Detailed Program Description: Parents As Teachers (PAT) is a national affiliate certified, voluntary home visitation program that works with families with children prenatal through kindergarten. Referrals can be made prenatal to three years old. The program is designed to keep children in the program for 2+ years. They graduate upon entering kindergarten. Services are available in English and Spanish. Program covers: Parent-child interactions, family well-being checks, family support assessments, domestic violence screenings, protective factor screenings, developmental screenings, hearing, vision, and general health. Topics: parent-child interaction, language development, fine motor and gross motor skills, and social-emotional development.

Detailed Program Description: Encouraging, empowering support for pregnant women on their wellness and recovery journey. Pregnancy can bring big changes, and navigating addiction or a history of substance use can make the journey feel even more overwhelming. The Recovery Nurse Advocate Program is here to offer compassionate, free support to pregnant women and new mothers during this important chapter of life. Nurse Advocates walk alongside each patient, offering steady, non-judgmental guidance. With kindness, encouragement, and practical support, the program helps parents build confidence, strengthen wellness, and prepare for life with their baby.

Nurse advocates provide one-on-one support to help pregnant patients who are addicted or struggle with past addiction to lead healthier and happier lives. Nurse Advocates offer assistance with:

- Connecting to prenatal care, substance use care and mental health care
- Baby supplies
- Transportation to medical visits until other resources can be put in place
- Learning about baby, body changes, and help prepare for delivery during pregnancy
- Learning about child's development during baby's first year
- Additional peer support through the Circle of Parents support group
- If additional prenatal, labor and postpartum support is needed, we can connect to doula or peer doula support

Services are available in-home, in-office, and in the community. Nurse Advocates and doulas can accompany patients to medical appointments. Doulas are available to attend deliveries.

Detailed Program Description: This is a free parent support program, focusing on 3 topics: parent/child interaction, home safety and health education. Parent Support Providers assist families in structuring daily activities, consistency, setting expectations and engaging children. Provide health education including a health manual and role play health scenarios; assist families to utilize the health system and respond to illness/injury with appropriate level of care. First aid kit and digital thermometer can be provided. Can assist with child proofing 3 rooms in the home, can provide safety supplies such as: baby gates, appliance locks, outlet covers, also provide education on household hazards. Focus on supervision, reducing hazards, safe sleep, etc. Families can engage in 1, 2 or all 3 topics. Each topic is about 6-8 weeks; visits occur 1x per week. Entire program can last about 6 months. First complete baseline assessment, then training and modeling, homework given, feedback is provided. Strength based program. Services offered in English, Spanish and other languages as needed with an interpreter.

Detailed Program Description: Preventative services offered through the Department of Children Youth and Families to prevent ongoing child welfare involvement in family's lives. Initially, a call must be made to the Jefferson County Child Welfare Hotline and determined to not meet state-defined criteria for an assessment for alleged abuse or neglect of a child. Once this determination is made, outreach is made to these families and services are provided on a voluntary basis.

Once contact is established, Prevention Specialists connect families to helpful services, work to build connections between families and local agencies and offer education, and guidance. Families are encouraged to be the guide of their future, determining what they need to succeed. The length of involvement can vary depending on a family's needs, but typically would not be longer than 2-4 months. While working with the family, a support plan will be developed to assist the family in reducing the likelihood of future participation with the child welfare system.

Populations served include children 0-18, parents, non-biological caregivers, expecting parents, foster youth in transition, LGBTQ+, schools and community agencies. Focus areas include community-based services, mental health, at-risk youth, student engagement, victim advocacy, public health programs, therapeutic interventions, parenting education, HeadStart, substance misuse support, program referrals, hygiene, food, and resource allocating.

In addition to direct family support, we prioritize collaboration with Jefferson County schools and other community partners. Our team offers training on mandatory reporting, services and resources and education on topics such as domestic violence, poverty, informed supervision and more. This team is available for consultation on community resources for any home visiting team.
