Creative Labor Unions

- A labor union is an **organization of workers who lobby for better workers' rights.**
- Unions can have many benefits, but they most notably lobby and negotiate for better workers' rights, including better pay, safer working conditions, and better benefits.
- Unions can be specific to a particular discipline or job field, geographic location, or even a specific company.
- There are requirements a person must meet in order to join a particular union.
- Unions are led and governed by union leaders elected by union members.
- Actions to achieve improved conditions take many forms of peaceful protest such as formal written proposals, petitions, strikes, walk-outs, and more.
