

The best dribblers in the history of European championships

Football fans are most attracted to attacking players, their actions, movements, feints, and so on. This is nothing new. The best dribblers from European tournaments

The list includes some rather unexpected names. For example, Wilfried Zaha is in fourth place with 972 dribbles. Although he plays for one of the weaker clubs in the Premier League, he has still distinguished himself individually. It's easy to follow this championship at a reliable bookmaker. If we talk about the top three dribblers in European championships over the past 20 years, they include:

- Franck Ribéry is in third place with 1,061 dribbles;

- Eden Hazard is in second place with 1,285 dribbles;
- Lionel Messi is in first place. He has performed 2,358 dribbles.

These figures confirm that individual skill can overshadow even club status. Wilfried Zaha, playing for teams outside the top six in the Premier League, managed to show an outstanding level of dribbling, finishing fourth in the ranking with 972 dribbles. Franck Ribéry, who shone at Bayern Munich, took third place with 1,061 successful attempts, while Eden Hazard, the star of Chelsea and Real Madrid, came second with 1,285 dribbles. The absolute leader is Lionel Messi. His 2,358 dribbles are not just a record, but a reflection of his genius and consistency over two decades.

These indicators are important not only for the history of football, but also for bettors who place **onlayn** bets on individual player actions at a reliable bookmaker, which also has a **kazino**.
