Official Rulebook : Registrations

World Cup 2020

1) Registrations:

Registration is open to all boards (2 teams maximum per board). As this is a team tournament (5 members per team), a manager will be designated for each board. He will be in charge of communicating information to the teams and will transmit the combos on time. To do so, he will send a private message to the organizers with the name of the team and its members. The same participant cannot be in several different teams.

Members of the same team must be on the same board. However, it is possible for small boards to create mixed teams (maximum 2 different boards for the same team).

Large boards: UPSB, JEB, PSH, FPSB (these boards are not allowed to form non-heterogeneous teams).

Registration will start on April 12th, 2020 at 0:00 am (GMT+1).

Registration will close on May 10th, 2020 at 23:59 (GMT+1). If after this deadline a team still wishes to register, it will have to ask the organizers for approval.

Note: It is possible for teams to have a substitute in case one of the team spinners can no longer return their combos, the latter will no longer be able to participate in the tournament until the end of the tournament. The substitute will then join the team as a regular member.

2) Tournament:

A) Introduction

The World Cup is a team tournament of 5 which will start on May 11, 2020 and end on August 2, 2020.

B) Structure

The first round will be a royal battle in the form of tag. The top 8 teams will advance to the quarterfinals.

This tag will be composed of a combo of each team member and edited according to the wishes of each one. (It will be judged according to the criteria of the duo theme and the editor of the video must be part of the team).

In accordance with the general ranking obtained during the Royal Battle, the quarter-final battles will be:

1v8

2v7

3v6

4v5

During these battles, a draw will be made to determine the form:

1) Difficulty:

A) Complexity

One member of each team will compete in a 1v1 battle. The theme of this battle will be complexity and hardlinks. (Criteria page 5)

B) Power

One member of each team will compete in a 1v1 battle. The theme of this battle will be powertricks and their chains. (Criteria page 5)

C) Taps and Counters

One member of each team will compete in a 1v1 battle. The theme of this battle will be taps and counters. (Criteria page 5)

2) Execution:

A) Aesthetism

One member of each team will compete in a 1v1 battle. The theme of this battle will be execution, style and aesthetics. (Criteria page 5)

B) Wipers

One member of each team will compete in a 1v1 battle. The theme of this battle will be wipers, their beauty and execution (Criteria page 5) The combo must be composed of at least 80% wipers, otherwise it will be irrelevant.

C) 1P2H

One member of each team will compete in a 1v1 battle with the theme 1 pen 2 hands, the execution of tricks with both hands, transitions and their beauty. The combo must be at least 50% 1P2H links, otherwise it will be out of the question. (Criteria page 5)

3) Duo:

Two members of each team will compete in a 2v2 battle with 2 combos per spinner. (Criteria page 5) The video must obligatorily be edited by one of the members of the team (but does not necessarily have to be part of the duo).

Only 3 of these specialties will be drawn. All the members of a team will therefore not participate in the same round, which will make it possible to set up a notion of strategy by not immediately using all its resources. This rule applies for round 2 and 3 only.

If the 3 1v1 specialties are drawn, we will have 3 1v1 battles between each member, three members of the team will participate. If 2 specialties 1v1 and theme 2v2 are drawn, four members of each team will participate.

Participants will be chosen by their teams to compete in a specialty. This choice will be communicated to the organizers at least 2 days before the deadline.

The team members in the finals will all submit a combo. As for round 2 and 3, the themes will be drawn at random. We will have either five 1v1 battles or three 1v1 battles and a duet. If the first three draws are 1v1 battles, we will automatically complete the rest of the 1v1 battles and exclude the duo. It should be noted that unlike round 2 and 3, the duo counts for 2 points in the final.
