Independent Research

In partners, you both will reflect on our year of studying History and consider what personal meaning you have found from it. You also both will demonstrate your mastery of the major skills we have practiced this year.

This project will be separated into 3 sections. Partners must successfully complete each section in order before they can move onto the next section. The 3 sections of this project are:

- 1. Written Reflection (30 points)
- 2. Further Reading and Research (30 points)
- 3. Artifact and Presentation (15 points)

In addition there will be a **Skill Check** in each section of the project. Each **Skill Check** will assess your mastery of a major skill that we focused on this year. The number of **Skill Checks** you complete will determine the highest grade you can earn on the project overall:

- 1. Partners who complete all 3 Skill Checks can earn up to 100%. (25 points)
- 2. Partners who complete 2 Skill Checks can earn up to 90%. (15 points)
- 3. Partners who complete 1 Skill Check can earn up to 73%. (8 points)
