<p>Can you spell uterus?</p> <p>U T E R U S</p>	<p>What is the placenta?</p> <p>It is an organ responsible for providing oxygen and nutrients and removing waste substances from the baby. It grows into the wall of the uterus and is joined to the fetus by the umbilical cord.</p>	<p>Why do women bleed every month through their vaginas?</p> <p>Because they expel the non fertilized ovum</p>
<p>What happens when the ovum doesn't meet any sperm?</p> <p>Women have their period</p>	<p>What is the female period?</p> <p>When the mature ovum reaches the uterus without meeting any sperm, the walls of the uterus detach and women have their period.</p>	<p>What is the endometrium?</p> <p>The layer of tissue that lines the uterus to receive the baby and hold them in the best conditions.</p>

<p>What do we call the female sex cells?</p> <p>Egg cells or ovum (ova)</p>	<p>What are the fallopian tubes?</p> <p>They are tubes that connect the ovary with the uterus. It's where the sperm usually meets the ovum.</p>	<p>What is the uterus?</p> <p>It is a hollow organ with a muscular wall where the baby develops.</p>
<p>What does the prostate gland do?</p> <p>It produces liquids which help to transport spermatozoa and provide them with nutrients</p>	<p>What is semen?</p> <p>It's the mixture of the liquid the prostate gland produces and the sperm.</p>	<p>Can you spell testicles?</p> <p>T E S T I C L E S</p>
<p>Testis produce semen True or false?</p> <p>False, they produce sperm, the semen is the mixture of sperm and the liquid produced by the prostate gland.</p>	<p>Do the excretory system and reproductive system share any organs?</p> <p>Yes they do, the urethra, but just males do.</p>	<p>What is fertilization?</p> <p>It happens when the sperm cell joins an egg cell..</p>
<p>What is pregnancy?</p> <p>It is the period from the moment of fertilization until the birth of a baby..</p>	<p>What is birth?</p> <p>It happens at the end of pregnancy, when the baby comes out of the mother's body.</p>	<p>What is lactation?</p> <p>It is the period when the mother's breasts produce milk. It happens after giving birth.</p>
<p>What do we call the bag where the baby develops in the uterus?</p> <p>It 's the placenta.</p>	<p>What are the primary sexual characteristics?</p> <p>The genital organs (reproductive organs). We are born with them.</p>	<p>What is puberty?</p> <p>It is the stage of life when reproductive organs become functional and secondary sexual characteristics develop.</p>
<p>When does puberty start?</p> <p>It may take place between the ages of 10 and 14 in girls and 12 and 16 in boys. However, these ages differ from person to person.</p>
