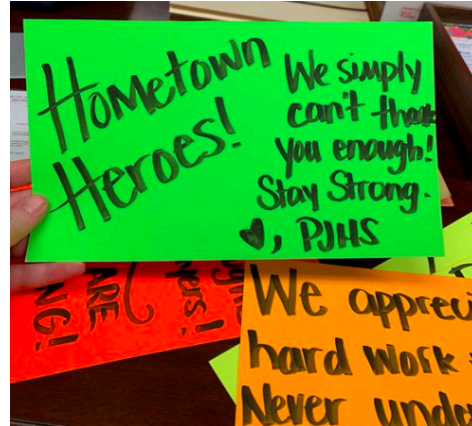

BEFORE SENDING YOUR LETTERS:

1. Letters should be legible (large print) and in ink
2. Sign letters only using your first name.
3. Avoid references to personally held beliefs such as political or religious affiliations.
4. Embrace creativity! Feel free to draw pictures. Recipients love it when the letters are personal.
5. Write a letter that is detailed, thoughtful and heartfelt. What kind of letter would you want to receive if you were a healthcare worker on the front line of COVID-19?
