### Welcome!

- The purpose of this green screen is to allow you to film effortlessly with the background of your choice. Through this tool, you can include yourself in a video with a background of your choosing.

# **Export Your Project**

- After filming in the video recording room, make sure to export your video. This
  step is important to the rest of the video. You must first save your video to use it
  in the editing process.
- To export, you will need to sign in to your Google Drive and drag in the footage that you plan on using for the greenscreen edit, or you can save your footage onto a flash drive.
- Once it is saved, you may log out of your account and move to a computer that
  has iMovie. For this guide, we will be using iMovie to replace the green screen
  with a video or image of your choice.

# **Produce Your Project**


- The Post Production Editing computers, located just outside of the Video Recording space, are equipped with a variety of editing software.
  - Video editing software on the Apple iMac computers includes Adobe
     Premiere Pro, Adobe After Effects, Final Cut Pro, and iMovie.
  - Dell Optiplex computers also have Adobe Premiere Pro and Adobe After Effects.
- For a more professional video project, try adding titles and color correcting your footage.
- You can also add sound effects, music, and voiceover to the video.
  - Try using our Group Recording rooms to record a voiceover to add to your video. These rooms are also a good location to work on video editing with a group.
  - Our Music Recording rooms have everything you need to create your own theme music. You can record your own music and then add it to your video project.

### **Editing Green Screen**


 Once signed into a computer that has iMovie, you can begin to edit your greenscreen effect.



First, import all of the footage that you plan on using on your project. You can
either import using the menu on the left, or simply drag and drop your footage



into the Import Media box.



 Second, drag the background image or video that you plan on using for the video into the project workspace of iMovie.



- This needs to be the first/lower layer of the footage. Next, drag down the video with the green screen background and place it on top of the background image.
  - o Click on the upper right corner of your screen where it shows a square within a square. (This looks like a crop icon.)
  - o Select the green screen option from the dropdown.
  - o Your video is now embedded with the green screen effect.






# Save Your Project

• Save your project by clicking the export icon in the top right corner.






• Click Export, and select a place where you want the video to show up.
