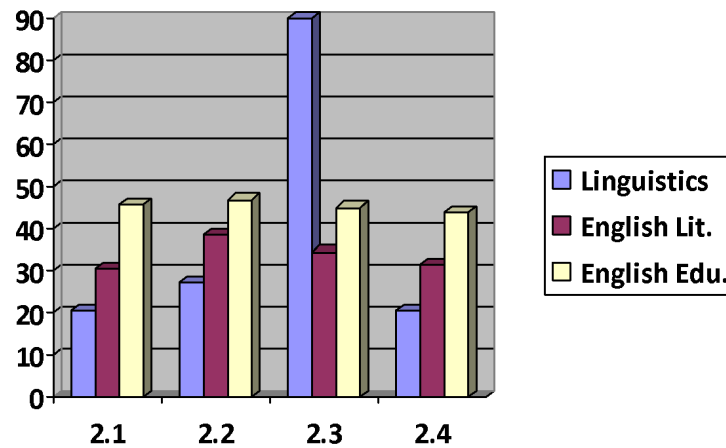


Figure 1. Number of sub theme published in IJOEP
