In this funny talk, Stella Young, who had a **low-key upbringing** in a small town, reflects on her life experiences, particularly after being **nominated** for a community achievement award at the age of 15.

2Growing up, she engaged in normal activities but found herself **objectified** as an inspiration solely due to her disability.

3She criticizes the **propagation** of what she terms "inspirational porn," images that **exceptionalize** disabled individuals for the benefit of non-disabled people.

4Embracing the social model of disability, she emphasizes that societal attitudes and barriers pose greater challenges than the actual impairments.

5 The speaker challenges the **notion** that disability makes someone exceptional, **advocating** for a world where disability is normalized, achievements are valued **genuinely**, and low expectations for disabled individuals are overcome.
