KIA Tigers right-hander Yoo Seung-chul (25) has joined Canberra Cavalier in the Australian professional baseball league. Yoo Seung-chul allowed one hit and one strikeout in one  $\frac{2}{3}$  against the Adelaide Giants on the 15th (Korea time) and allowed two hits and one strikeout in two  $\frac{1}{3}$  against the Adelaide Giants on the 17th.

Yoo Seung-cheol is a right-handed fireballer who graduated from Suncheon Hyocheon High School and joined the club as the first candidate in 2017. He throws fastballs in the low 150km range, but has yet to pop due to ball control and command issues. He has four wins, one save and three holds with an ERA of 5.55 in 64 games played in the top-tier professional league.

He finished his military service, but failed to rebound. He also appeared in only one game this season. The depth of KIA's bullpen is thick, but the right-hander needs to be reinforced. This is because he has been dependent on Triple J (Jung Hae-young, Jeon Sang-hyun and Jang Hyun-sik) for many years. There is nothing like Yoo Seung-chul taking the position in the first division next year.

After finishing his training in Okinawa, Yoo said on Kia's YouTube channel "Gyativi" that he should learn how to deal with batters and control of the ball. Gyativi also included communication with pitchers coach Chung Jae-hoon after receiving intensive guidance.

The effectiveness of the game needs to be checked in real life. Kia said it will send Kwak to its drive line in Seattle on Tuesday. In other words, Kwak Do-gyu, who had been playing for Canberra, has returned to Korea, and Yoo Seung-cheol seems to have filled the vacancy.

He got off to a good start. Actually, he got off to a two-run double as soon as he came on top of the sixth inning, when his team was trailing 2-4 in the game on Sunday. However, he did not give up a point as he did not take a follow-up hit. However, he neatly handled three batters in the seventh inning, and had a hit with two outs in the top of the eighth inning when his team came from behind to 7-6, but he did not give up a follow-up hit. A dramatic relief win.

Prior to that, he gave up a timely two-run hit in the top of the fifth inning, when his team was leading 4-1, but he did not take a follow-up hit. In the sixth inning, he garnered three outs and three outs. Ultimately, he gave up the opportunity to send the successor to the team home for two consecutive games. However, he deserves confidence in that he has not completely collapsed and has had no run. Crucially, he has not given up any walk during four innings.

Since he joined the club mid-season, he may appear more frequently in the future. For now, he is off to a good start in Australia. Canberra will hold four consecutive games against the Sydney White Sox from Tuesday.
