# **ODDER by Applegate, Katherine (3-4)**

Like her Newbery winning title *The One and Only Ivan, Odder* is written in verse from the perspective of the animal, in this case Odder, an orphaned otter. Odder is a delightful and playful otter whose positive nature is put to the test when faced with a terrible shark attack. Students couldn't wait to see what happened next with this intrepid otter!




## THE ONE AND ONLY IVAN (series) by Applegate, Katherine (3-4)

This beloved Newbery series has finally been completed in a quartet of novels. Ivan is an easy-going gorilla living at the Exit 8 Big Top Mall and Video Arcade; he has grown accustomed to humans watching him through the glass walls of his domain. Then he meets Ruby, a baby elephant taken from her family, and she makes Ivan see their home through new eyes. Each book centers on a different character in Ivan's world except for the final one, where Ivan becomes a proud father.



## MAC B. KID SPY (series) by Barnett, Mac (3-4)

A thrilling, hilarious fully-illustrated spy adventure series, from the beloved picture book author Mac Barnett! Before Mac Barnett was an author, he was a kid. And while he was a kid, he was a spy. Not just any spy—he was a spy for the Queen of England! From secret identities to Karate hijinks, this fast-paced, witty and historically inspired chapter book will keep readers guessing until the very last page.



# EERIE ELEMENTARY: THE SCHOOL IS ALIVE! (series) by Chabert, Jack (3)

When Sam Graves is assigned to be the hall monitor, he has no idea just how dangerous a job it is. He is positive the school is trying to eat him, but nobody believes him except for a creepy old janitor. Then at the school play, the school becomes more dangerous than ever, and it's up to Sam to save everyone. Sequel: *The Locker Ate Lucy* 



# JACK STALWART: ESCAPE OF THE DEADLY DINOSAUR (series) by Hunt, Elizabeth Singer (3)

Kids looking for adventure series now have even more options. The Escape of the Deadly Dinosaur by Elizabeth Singer Hunt, heralds the action-heavy Secret Agent Jack Stalwart series, which stars nine-year old Jack, a member of the top secret Global Protection Force. In this opening installment, he travels to the Big Apple to put the brakes on a dinosaur running loose in the city.



# PERCY JACKSON: THE LIGHTNING THIEF (series) by Riordan, Rick (4)

This mega-popular series has sold millions of copies worldwide and has been translated into several languages. Meet Percy Jackson, a boy who seems to have the worst luck ever! Luckily, he is half-god, unluckily - he has to go on a quest to save the world.



# SASQUATCH ESCAPE (series) by Selfors, Suzanne (3-4)

Ben is set for boredom in his grandpa's rundown town of Buttonville, until he and reckless Pearl Petal take a wounded baby dragon to the only veterinarian, Dr. Woo at her "Worm Hospital" -- actually for creatures from an imaginary world. After Ben leaves the front door unlocked, the intrepid pair must rescue the escaped giant sasquatch.



### FICTION: FANTASY AND SCIENCE FICTION

Fantasy stories are deliberately freed from reality. High fantasies take place in another world (e.g., *Harry Potter*). Low fantasies feature magical events in this world. Science fiction is based on imagined future scientific or technological advances and frequently portrays space or time travel and life on other planets.



## **ZOEY AND SASSAFRAS (series) by Citro, Asia**

Zoey is a budding young scientist who just learned the family secret they see magical forest creatures! But when an injured dragon shows up while Zoey's mom is at a conference, it's up to Zoey to figure out how to save the day using scientific method. Written by a real life scientist, this STEM book series has captivated many students who enjoy both fantasy and science.



# GREGOR THE OVERLANDER (series) by Collins, Suzanne (4)

You've likely heard of *The Hunger Games* but did you know that before that series. Suzanne Collins wrote a book series for younger children? Gregor is a typical big brother, helping watch his baby sister while doing his chores. When she disappears however, Gregor discovers she isn't missing - she has been kidnapped and brought to the underworld! And it's up to him to go on a quest to rescue his sister!

## CHARLIE & THE CHOCOLATE FACTORY (3-4)


### JAMES & THE GIANT PEACH (3-4)




#### MATILDA (4)




saintly patience, and an innate predilection to set things right!


## FLORA & ULYSSES by DiCamillo, Kate (3-4)

### DORY FANTASMAGORY (series) by Hanlon, Abby (3)

Dory's older siblings may roll their eyes at her childish games, but Dory has lots of things to do: outsmarting the monsters all over the house, moving into the closet, and exacting revenge on her sister's favorite doll. And when they really need her, daring Dory will prove her bravery, and finally get exactly what she has been looking for. With plenty of pictures bursting with charm and character, this hilarious book about an irresistible rascal is a delightful series.



### THE BUTTON BOX by Hodder, Bridget (4)

Ava is Jewish, her cousin Nadeem is Muslim, and they both love their wise, possibly magical, Jewish Granny Buena. When Granny stops midtale, Ava takes the button — magically transporting the children and Granny's cat Sheba to the marketplace at Sabtah at the moment Granny stopped the story!




# HEROES IN TRAINING: ZEUS AND THE THUNDERBOLT OF DOOM (series) by Holub, Joan (3-4)


### WINGS OF FIRE (series) by Sutherland, Tui (3-4)


# RANGER IN TIME: RESCUE ON THE OREGON TRAIL (series) by Messner, Kate (3-4)

THE STORY OF ... (biography series) by Various Authors (3-4) This new biography series is a wonderful improvement on the famed "Who Was" series. Targeted for a slightly younger audience, this series has delighted 3rd and 4th graders as the books are full color and filled with illustrations, timelines and fun facts. Each book in the series focuses on a single individual. Favorite biographies include Jackie

Robinson, Stan Lee and Ruby Bridges.



# TRUMPET OF THE SWAN by White, E. B. (3-4)

Although this was published fifty-five years ago, this book remains a forever favorite and is considered to be one of the greatest works of children's literature. 
# THE SUPER LIFE OF BEN BRAVER (series) by Emerson, Marcus (4)


## THE 13-STORY TREEHOUSE (series) by Griffiths, Andy (4)

Also, please consider the sequel: *My Head has a Bellyache*.



# MYTH-O-MANIA: HAVE A HOT TIME HADES (series) by McMullan, Kate (4)

This playful and hysterical retelling of Greek Gods comes from Kate McMullan, an A-S grandparent! (Younger boys may be more familiar with her *I Stink!* picture book series.) Join a bitter Hades as he exposes his brother Zeus for being a Myth-O-Manic (old Greek for "liar") as he recounts the takeover of Mount Olympus. Boys LOVED hearing the beginning of this title when we read it aloud during a book tasting. They've been flying off of the library shelves ever since.



#### Uss, Christina ERIK VS. EVERYTHING

Erik's family is deeply proud of the adventurous spirit from their Viking-heritage, unfortunately Erik feels very differently. While his family members each have an adventurous motto for fighting and conquering, Erik's motto is to "avoid stuff." This motto becomes hard to follow when his wild and hilarious axe-wielding family decide to physically combat Erik's and his fears. Boys who love heartfelt and humorous adventure tales will really enjoy this one.




#### FICTION: MYSTERIES AND THRILLERS

But when the kids wake up, they discover a new game is afoot: whoever can find a way out of Mr. Lemoncello's library will win the grand prize.



# BALLPARK MYSTERIES (series) by Kelly, David A. (3)

Thanks to Kate's mom (a sports reporter), cousins Mike Walsh and Kate Hopkins have tickets to a Red Sox game and All Access passes to Fenway Park. But as they're watching batting practice before the game, the lucky bat of Red Sox star slugger is stolen right in front of dozens of people. Without the bat, D can't seem to hit a thing. Can Kate and Mike figure out who pinched the bat before D and the Sox chalk up a loss? Cross Ron Roy's mystery series with Matt Christopher's sports books and you get the Ballpark Mysteries: fun, puzzling whodunnits aimed right at beginning readers. Each book takes place in a different MLB ballpark.



### THE MYSTERIOUS MOONSTONE (series) by Luper, Eric (3-4)

After a second school librarian disappears, students Erin and Cleo discover that she has been sucked up into the world of the book! In this mysterious first story, Evan and Cleo must follow a series of clues to set her free and uncover a stolen priceless diamond. Fans of the *Magic Tree House* will enjoy this series for older readers.



# THE A-Z MYSTERIES (series) by Roy, Ron (3)

This beloved chapter book mystery series is a huge hit for readers who are transitioning to middle grade chapter books. The unique genre identifications that group books thematically – including mystery, fantasy, fiction, true stories, humor, history, and classic - make it easy for readers to select their favorite subjects.



## TIMMY FAILURE (series) by Pastis, Stephan (3-4)

Eleven-year-old Timmy Failure is the clueless, comically self-confident CEO of the best detective agency in town, perhaps even the nation. Add his impressively lazy business partner, a very large polar bear named Total and throw in the Failuremobile, Timmy's mom's Segway, and what you have is Total Failure, Inc.



## The Secret of the Jade Bangle (series) by Trinh, Linda (3)

When Anne and her younger siblings Jacob and Liz are given gifts passed on to them by their Grandma, Anne soon realizes that hers - a beautiful jade bangle - has a secret power. One that might just give her the strength to stand up to her ballet teacher, who treats her differently than her white classmates, and embrace her Vietnamese identity through cooking Grandma's recipes. No matter how difficult things get, Anne learns that the love of her ancestors is always with her.




# **FICTION: REALISTIC**


## **BECAUSE OF WINN DIXIE by DiCamillo, Kate (3)**

Although she has won numerous accolades (including a Newbery and Caldecott) for fantastical tales, this vulnerable and moving true-life story is the one Grace wishes she had when she was a kid.



# ALVIN HO: ALLERGIC TO GIRLS, SCHOOL, AND OTHER SCARY THINGS (series) by Look, Lenore (3-4)

Second grader Alvin Ho fears everything. Most of all, he is afraid of school. So afraid that he is totally unable to speak in class. However, at home he becomes a very loud superhero named Firecracker Man. While reading this book, you come to empathize with and really enjoy Alvin.




# SHELTER PET SQUAD (series) by Lord, Cynthia (3-4)


# CILLA LEE JENKINS: FUTURE AUTHOR EXTRAORDINAIRE (series) by Tan, Susan (3-4)


## FRONT DESK (series) by Yang, Kelly (4)




## **NEW KID (series) by Craft, Jerry (4)**


## **GREEN LANTERN: LEGACY by Lê, Minh**


# TRYOUTS by Sax, Sarah (3-4)
