

Falmouth School Board
Regular Meeting Minutes
September 17, 2018

1. **CALL TO ORDER:** The meeting was called to order by Danielle Tracy at 7:02 p.m. in the Falmouth Elementary School Cafeteria. Present were Nicole Bezanson, Caryn Bickerstaff, Whitney Bruce, Julie Fraser, Jen Libby, Julia Lucas, Danielle Tracy, Student Representative Neeya Rostampour and Superintendent Geoff Bruno, and 13 community members (H. Stark excused).
2. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE:** All in attendance recited the Pledge of Allegiance.
3. **ADJUSTMENTS TO THE AGENDA:** There were none.

5. **COMMUNICATION:**
 - A. **Student Representatives Report** – Neeya Rostampour stated that students are getting adjusted to being back in school. The activities fair was held, which is always an exciting time for students. Because of the new orientation, ninth graders seems to have fewer questions about where classrooms are. Fall fest planning is in full swing and all sports teams are doing well.
6. **SUPERINTENDENT’S REPORT:** Superintendent Bruno thanked everyone--students, parents, custodians, staff, and bus drivers--for the smooth opening of school. He stated the Challenge Success presentation to parents on September 4 had a great turnout and good information was disseminated. Discussion on the survey will continue at the October 1, 2018 School Board workshop.
7. **LEADERSHIP COUNCIL REPORTS:**
 - A. Falmouth Elementary School - Gloria Noyes stated the “meet & greets” went well and four out of the six open houses have taken place. Mrs. Noyes thanked Lebel & Harriman, LLP, for their generous donation of a large collection of school supplies for FES students.
 - B. Falmouth Middle School - Janet Adams stated the enrollment numbers at the middle school are up (551) and new staff and students are settling in nicely. She stated Sarah DeLuca has jumped right into her position and has already become comfortable in her new role.
 - C. Falmouth High School - Peter Badalament indicated the freshman enjoyed a very different style of orientation this year with a new focus placed on connecting them to one another, to upperclassmen, and to their advisors. He is pleased to report that the number of schedule

change requests this year was down with most students attending all of the classes they selected last spring.

- D. Director of Special Services - Gene Kucinkas stated as he was walking around to each of the buildings recently, it struck him that the one campus has come to fruition and many benefits have been realized.
- E. Director of Learning - Gretchen McNulty thanked everyone who attended the Challenge Success presentation on September 4. Staff continue to examine the data and there will be further district wide discussions in October. She indicated a new intercultural and inclusion committee will be formed soon, and we are looking for students and parents to join. Mrs. McNulty also stated there are many resources on our website for grading and report.
